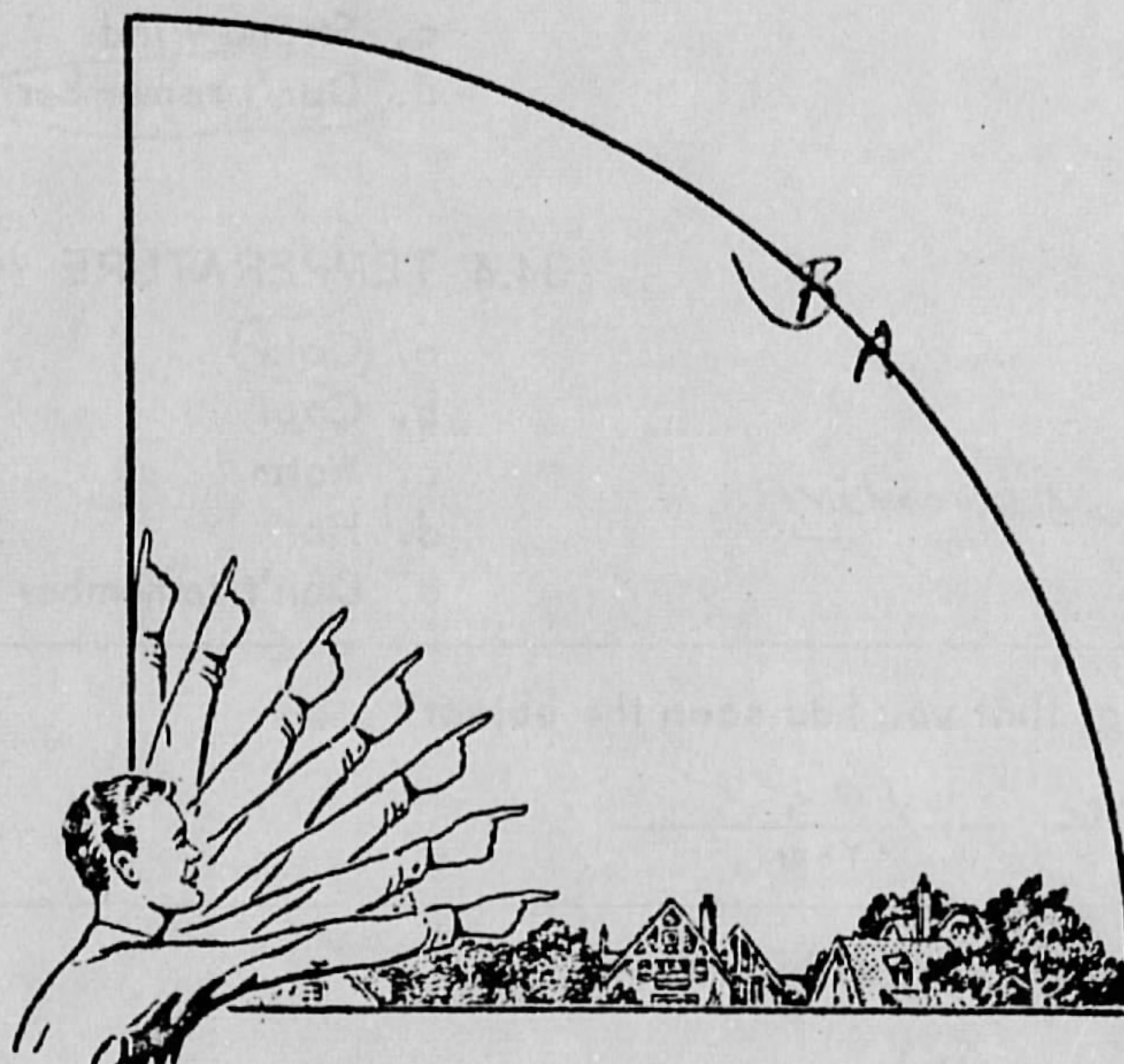

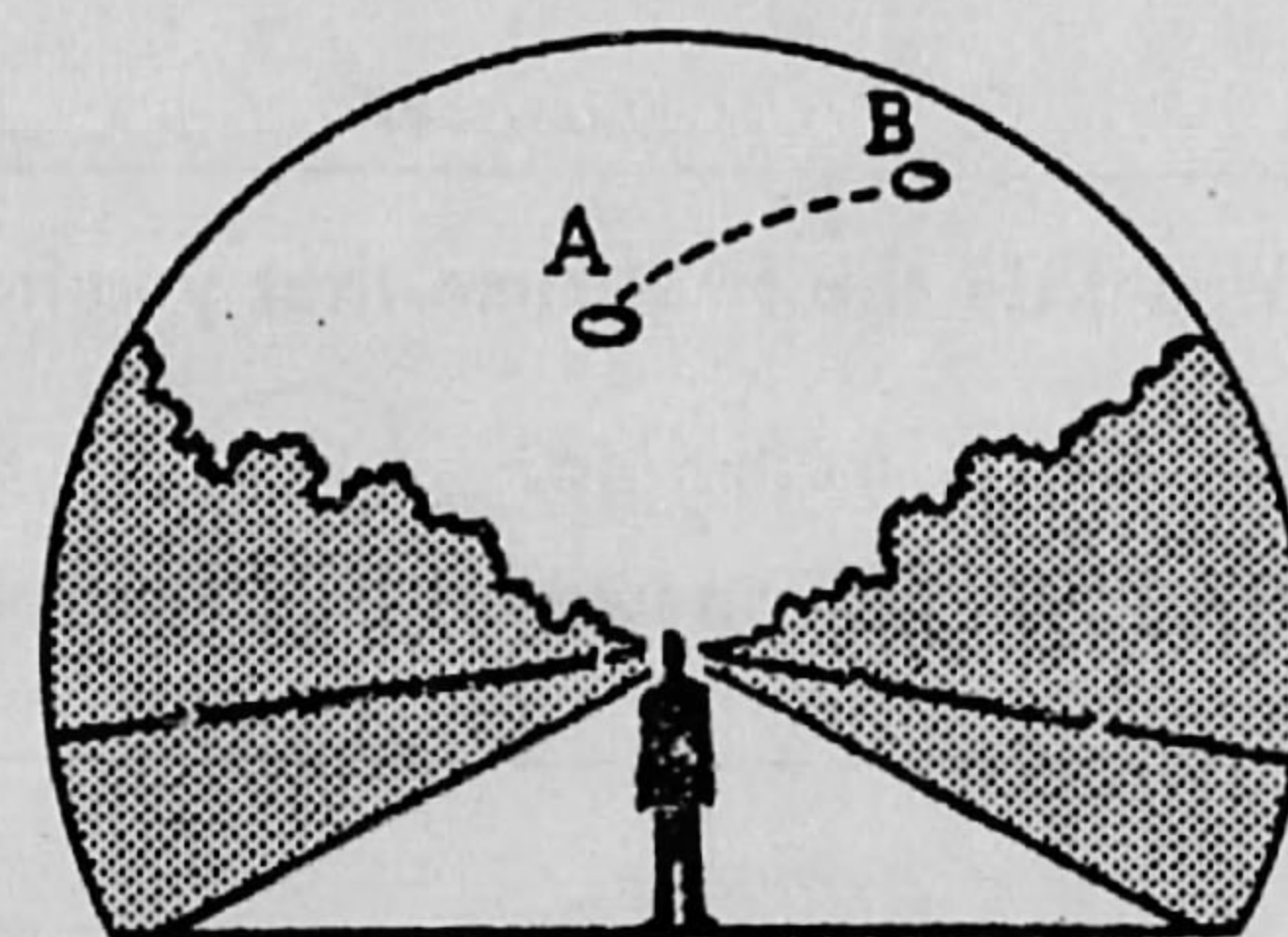

To answer no. 10 - The brightness was similar to the sun only it wasn't hard on my eyes. It was brighter than anything I know of. Inside of the circle I have around on pg. 3 but outside of that circle it was pitch black. And between the flat bottom part and the half moon top, there was something alive.

I just can't explain it on paper, but there was life there in certain. Nothing human, but alive. I couldn't see any form or outline but it was like a person walking in front of a light. Like hurried movements. Not one but many things. I say not human because what ever it was had made me sick to my stomach ever since. Not the ship but what was happening between the saucer and the top. It just hit me right in the pit of my stomach and now if I look where I saw it as picture in my mind, (that hurried movements), I get so nauseated. I know it will sound crazy to you, but it's the truth. And what ever it was I'm sure they saw me when I moved and I felt as though they knew just what I was thinking. I felt as though they had a telescope or something pointed at me. If I was talking to you I'm sure I could make you understand but I can't seem to on paper.

Then I went to bed. I still felt as though I imagined it all, even
 tho Freddie saw it was there. I got up came down and looked
 again, but it was pitch dark, no stars or moon. Then Christmas
 Eve I thought I'd check on the moon. So about 9 p.m. I did it was
 no where near where I saw the object. It was straight up from our
 door yard. Then the 26th Freddie said, "You know I wish I had
 of taken a good look at that thing, it couldn't possibly have been
 the moon. I can see why he thought it was. It being up and seeing
 something big and gold in the sky, that's the first thing anyone
 would think of first. So he can't very well make out his paper
 not knowing anything about it except that it was there. That's why
 I knew I didn't imagine it all because he saw it there. I said,
 9:30 light m.d. you can think so many thing in a min. But I saw
 the light a long time before the ship appeared but when it disappeared
 the light didn't stay behind so long. That's why I wonder if when I
 thought it stopped it might have speeded up, where it went faster
 then it came. Well this is the oddest yet. The next morning as I looked
 at our lake just below where it was. I'd say it was clear over
 land then the lake. Well it was just like a small stream of
 water over the snow. Like in the spring when the lake ^{opens}
 up above, the water will melt down little stream down across
 the snow. It was like that. So it may have been that but I
 never saw anything leave it to land or anything like that. I'm
 not sure of our temperature, but fairly certain it was way below
 zero. There must of been some connection there someplace. Well
 it all sounds crazy I know but here it is anyway. Please,
 excuse all these mistakes in writing. Do you think a flash
 camera would get a picture of that? I do, I keep mine handy
 and if I ever see it again, I want to get a picture of it
 if I get the courage to go out doors.

It happened like this.

I just turned out my kitchen light, to go to bed. I saw this red glare. I thought it was a fire ~~to~~^{on} Washburn Road. So I thought I would wait and if I could see the flames I'd know just about where it was. Then it got brighter and brighter, so bright it just couldn't seem to get any brighter, and then it just came right out of the sky.

It either came from behind a cloud as the light was so bright it showed miles ahead of the ship. The light was so bright it would show through the blackest cloud anyway. Well I just stood there stunned, I couldn't believe my eyes. I thought they were playing tricks on me. I could see the flat bottom part ~~to~~ going round and round real fast. Almost too fast for the eye to see it.

I thought it was a space ship, my husband (Freddie) was to bed sound asleep. I called for him to come down never taking my eyes off from it. I was sure it was going to disappear before he saw it.

But when he was half way down our stairs the bottom part stopped going around as ~~the~~ else it sped up so fast that it looked stopped to my eyes. Freddie came I can't say he was very much awake, he's so hard to wake up suddenly like that. He took one look at it and said, it was the moon. Then I took my eyes from it to look at him, I said, just like this "Are you crazy? Where did you ever see a moon, like that?" He then went back to bed.
