It is highly unlikely that an object, be it balloon or star, would remain stationary over that period of time. The observer possibly saw a balloon at the initial sighting.

- (1) As B-36 passed I watched it. This attracted my attention to the area where I noticed the object.

- (3) Same location.
- (4) Practically no travel. I referred position to nearby trees.

(5) I stopped watching to go into my house for binoculars.
I was unable to relocate the object.

(6) I watched it continuously for about one minute.
I relocated it three or four times for shorter intervals.
