- (b) Size - Approximate size of half-dollar piece, 12 held in palm of hand at arms length. (Object was observed at approximately 30,000 feet altitude.)
- (c) Color - Gave off a brilliant light as if it was a large mirror reflecting the sun's rays.
- (d) Number - One (1)

- (a) What first called attention to object? - Intensity of Light.

- ① Balloon (Wx) normally launched o/a 1030.
- ② Luke AFB + Williams AFB very close to VFD location. Wx balloon hits at WINGLOW + PRESCOTT.
- ③ Based on numerous balloon reports from desert regions - eye witness reflection of sun's rays off surface of balloon shows up as exceptionally bright light.

Prob Balloon
