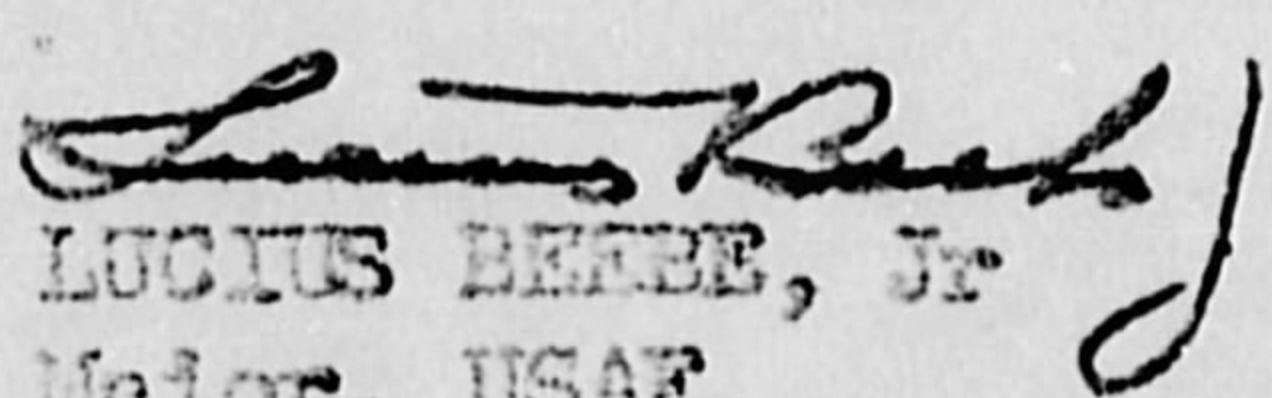

SUBJECT Unidentified Flying Object

At 1025Z, 4 May 57, while on a routine Airborne Operation Center mission, 2/Lt. Leland M. Martin, Co-pilot, sighted a meteor-like object of yellowish-red color pass in front of the Aircraft at 10,000 feet going in an East-West direction. At 1043Z an object of the same description passed in front of the aircraft at approximately 8,000 feet going in an East-West direction. The objects were described as similar to "afterburner on F-102." Land based radar station Art reported no known aircraft were in the area. Two USN submarines were operating in the area of the sighting. Crew members speculated the UFO's may have been rockets from a nearby danged area.

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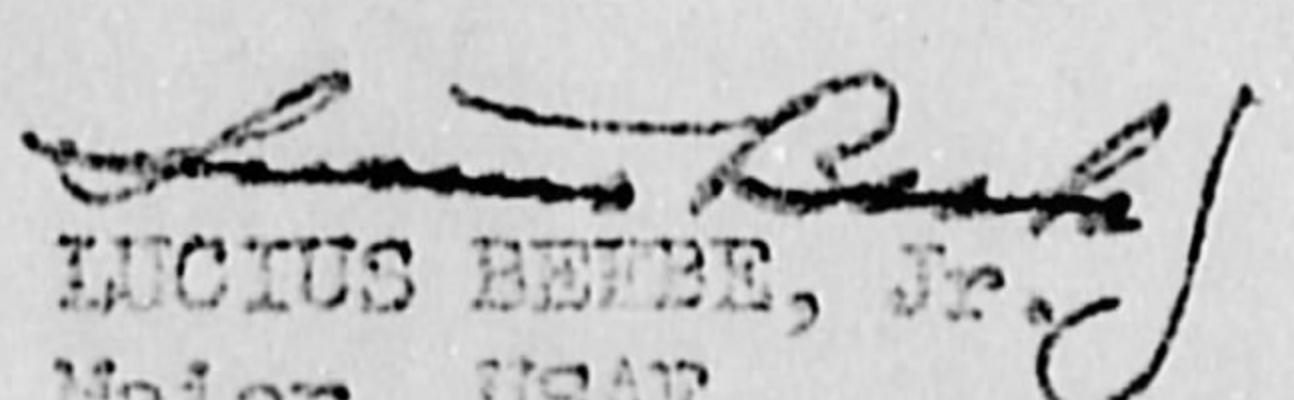
