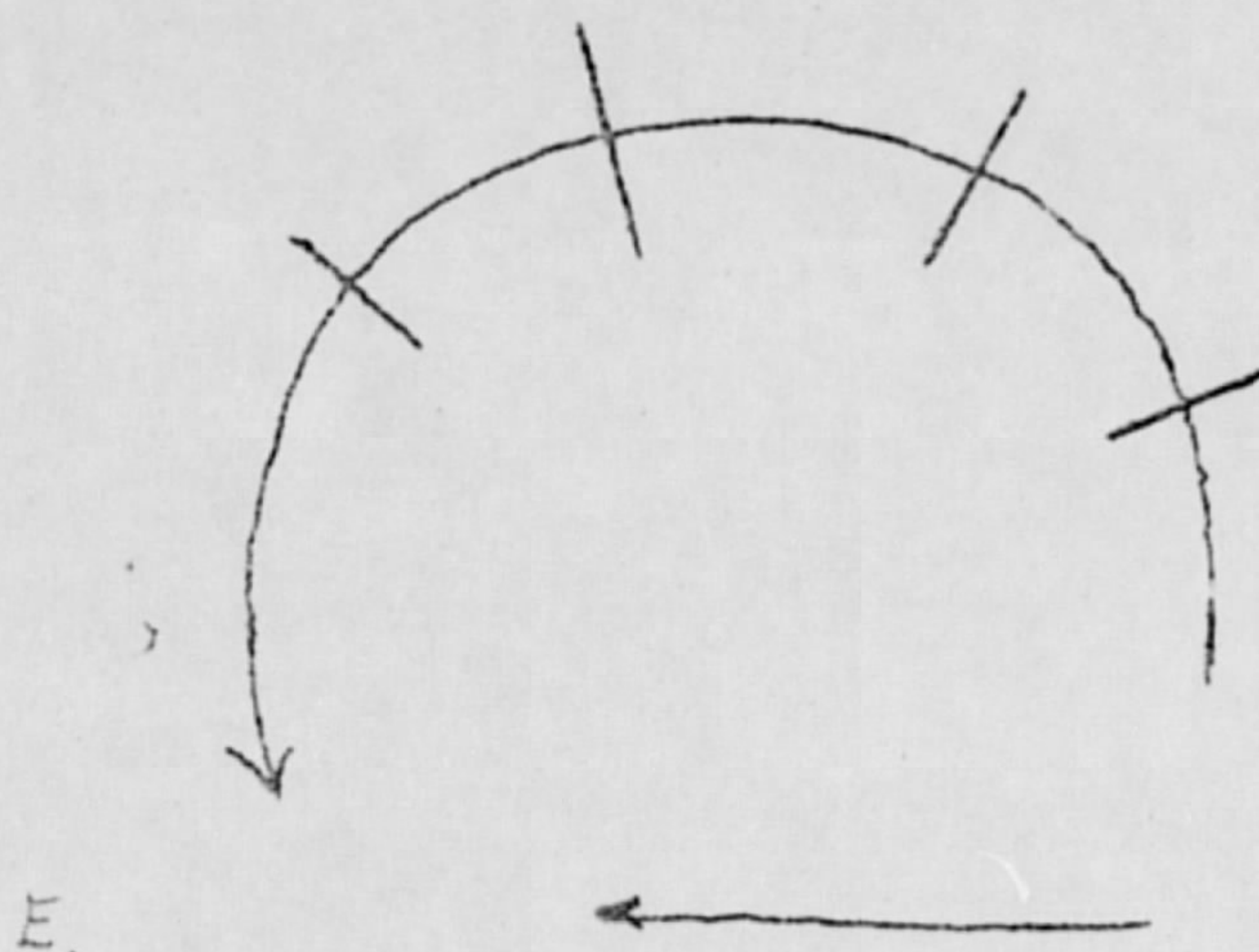

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Description: Vapor trail arc developed as a very faint and narrow trail. Pattern showed a full 180 degree turn and formed in about twelve seconds. No plane or object visible ahead of trail. Unusual pattern developed from what appeared to be vapor trails which developed at right angles to the arc as shown below. These crosses developed progressively with the formation of the trail but appeared wider than the trail itself. Within about a half minute a second trail developed moving from west to east in a straight line. The trails disappeared within five minutes.
