11. Report prepared by Major John W. Porter, Chief Flight Operations Division, Robins Air Force Base, Georgia. Cause unknown. Reliability questioned due to limited sighting by only observers listed during the occurrence over a heavily populated area at a time other personnel would normally be outdoors.

The above report is as originally submitted by Sergeant Brown, however, on contacting Mrs. [REDACTED] the following was added. At 062330Z upon walking out of the door to her home her attention was attracted by the blinding white light of an object in flight from east to west approaching at excessive speed approximately 150 feet above the ground. The object seemed to pause overhead and suddenly make a 90 degree ascent to the altitude as described in Sergeant Brown's report. At this time Mrs. [REDACTED] called the other observers as listed and she remained indoors with a baby while the other observers watched the object until it disappeared. Mrs. [REDACTED] described the object as being approximately the size of a small civilian aircraft such as Piper Cub with six distinct rays of blinding light being projected from six pointed areas protruding from the surface of the object.

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
