Strange but Astro checks a computer - shows the MOON near or at the horizon, at the time and in the general azimuth (35°) given by source. Also bright star CAPRICORN that locality. GOC observer should know these bodies unless picked up on high-power binoculars - and then conditions gave them a weird appearance (Hazy eyes like this from GOC posts mainly by civilians)
