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I. PREAMBLE:

S was very cooperative throughout the interview. [redacted] His command of German was poor, because he had not spoken the language during the last several years. He was a fair judge of distances, but a poor map reader. No inconsistencies were noted in his statements. Reliability of S could not be judged.

S lived and worked on his fathers' farm in the small village GARWOL (5121N/1642E) as farmhand between Oct 57 and Mar 58. Observed an unidentified flying object as described below in Nov 57 just after darkness (1800 hrs). S was able to recall in detail all he had seen. Info was acquired through personal observation, unless otherwise stated. Dimensions, distances and numbers are approx, unless otherwise specified. Probability of info could not be judged.

II. UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECT (UFO) AT GARWOL:

a. Description of the object:

- (1) Rectangular shaped. *note*
- (2) Size of object 30 cm long, 10 cm wide.
- (3) Collar was yellowish-orange.
- (4) One.
- (5) N/A.
- (6) S could not see any features.
- (7) Object could have been exhaust of an unidentified object. *many find*
- (8) No sound was heard.
- (9) N/A.

This definitely suggests a wing - assuming the long end may find (not square)

b. Description of course of object:

- (1) Attention of observer was first called to object because of its illumination.
- (2) Angle of object when first observed approx 15 degrees.
- (3) At disappearance angle plus 5 degrees (horizon).
- (4) Object described flew straight path from SSW direction to position overhead and kept on to disappear towards WNW.
- (5) Object disappeared below horizon to the NNE.
- (6) Time of flight 15-20 seconds. *← note*

c. Manner of observation.

- (1) Object was seen visually from ground.
- (2) No optical aids were used.
- (3) N/A.

** Everything has a/c position seen only due to darkness*

d. Time and date of sighting.

- (1) Time of observation around 1800 hours in Nov 57 on unspecified day.
- (2) It was night. *← note NO DAY GIVEN*

e. Location of observer.

(1) S himself located in yard of fathers' farm at small village GARWOL (5121N/1642E). Location of fellow citizen (name unkn) whom S spoke to the following day, had been the town of WOHLAU (WOLOF) (5120N/1639E). Time period approx the same.

f. Identifying info on observer.

- (1) Civilian, [redacted] 22 years old; HO [redacted] *Immer*
[redacted] GOARSHAUSEN, Germany, driver. Name of fellow citizen not *very little*
known.
