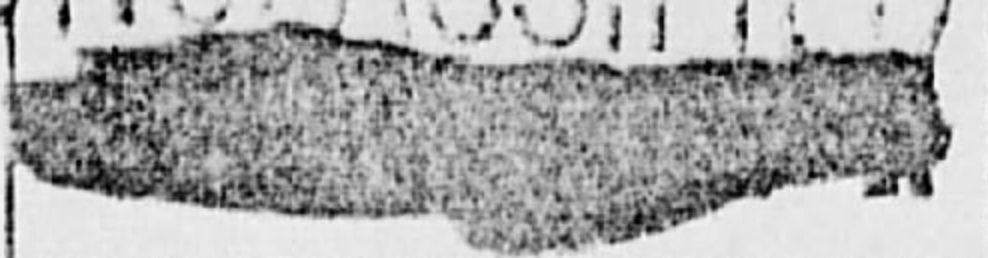

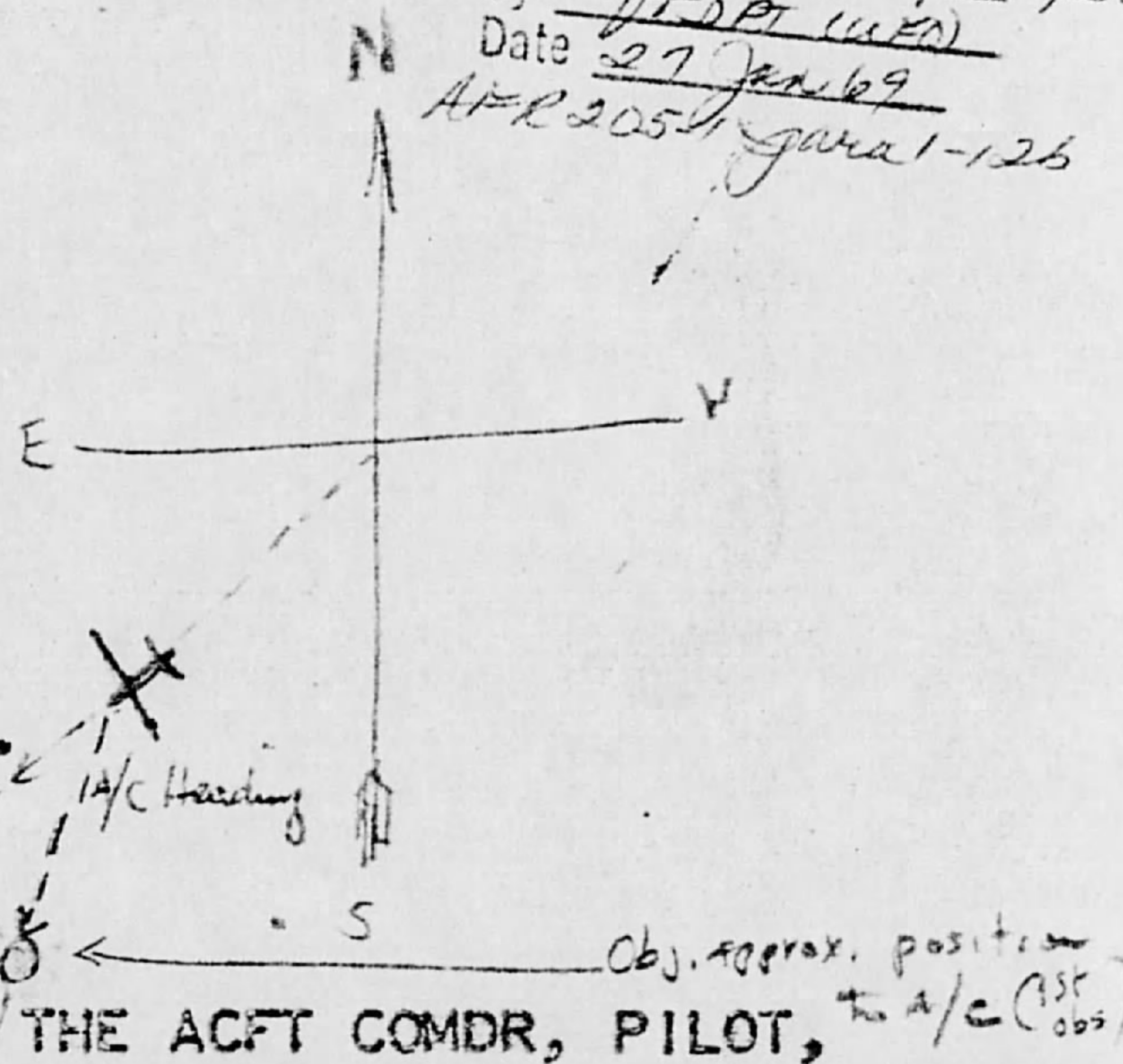

WHITE FLASH AT 1130 OCLOCK ACFT POSITION. FLASH SLIGHTLY HIGHER THAN ACFT. A BLUE GREEN FLARE LIKE OBJECT EMERGED FROM THE FLASH. IT FOLLOWED A FLAT PATH TOWARD THE ACFT MOVING FROM THE 1130 OCLOCK POS TO THE 1230 OCLOCK POS. SPARKS WERE OBSERVED FOLLOWING OBJECT. OBJECT BURNED OUT AN ESTIMATED 500' ABOVE NOSE OF ACFT. DURATION OF SIGHTING APPROX 3 SECONDS. THE CFC AND LEFT GUNNER OBSERVED BILLIANT WHITE FLASH AT 1000 OCLOCK MEDIUM HIGH ACFT POS, THEN BLUE GREEN BALL TRAILING A BLUE GREEN TAIL AND SHOWERING SPARKS FOLLOWING A FLAT DOWNWARD PATH TOWARD ACFT. DISAPPEARING ACROSS NOSE AND APPROX 500' ABOVE ACFT. FROM [REDACTED] VOICE COMMUNICATIONS WERE INTERCEPTED AND RECORDED. VOICE COMMUNICATIONS STOPPED ABRUPTLY AT [REDACTED].

1. Attached reports are forwarded for your review as possible indications of foreign missile activities, and therefore of interest to your division.

2. The characteristics, descriptions, and patterns in the report are those of a true bolide or "fireballs", an unusually large number which have been reported during the last year. However, this does not rule out the possibility of missiles.

3. The reason for submitting these is that within two months substantially the same objects, in the same area and within 30 miles of each other were reported by both the Air Force and the Navy. A rough plot of the direction of travel of one object (assuming the UFO to be a missile) indicates that the point of origin could be the northernmost point of the Sakhalins. A plot of the other also indicates that the point of origin could be in the same general area, although the direction of travel is in another direction, proceeding on the same assumption.
