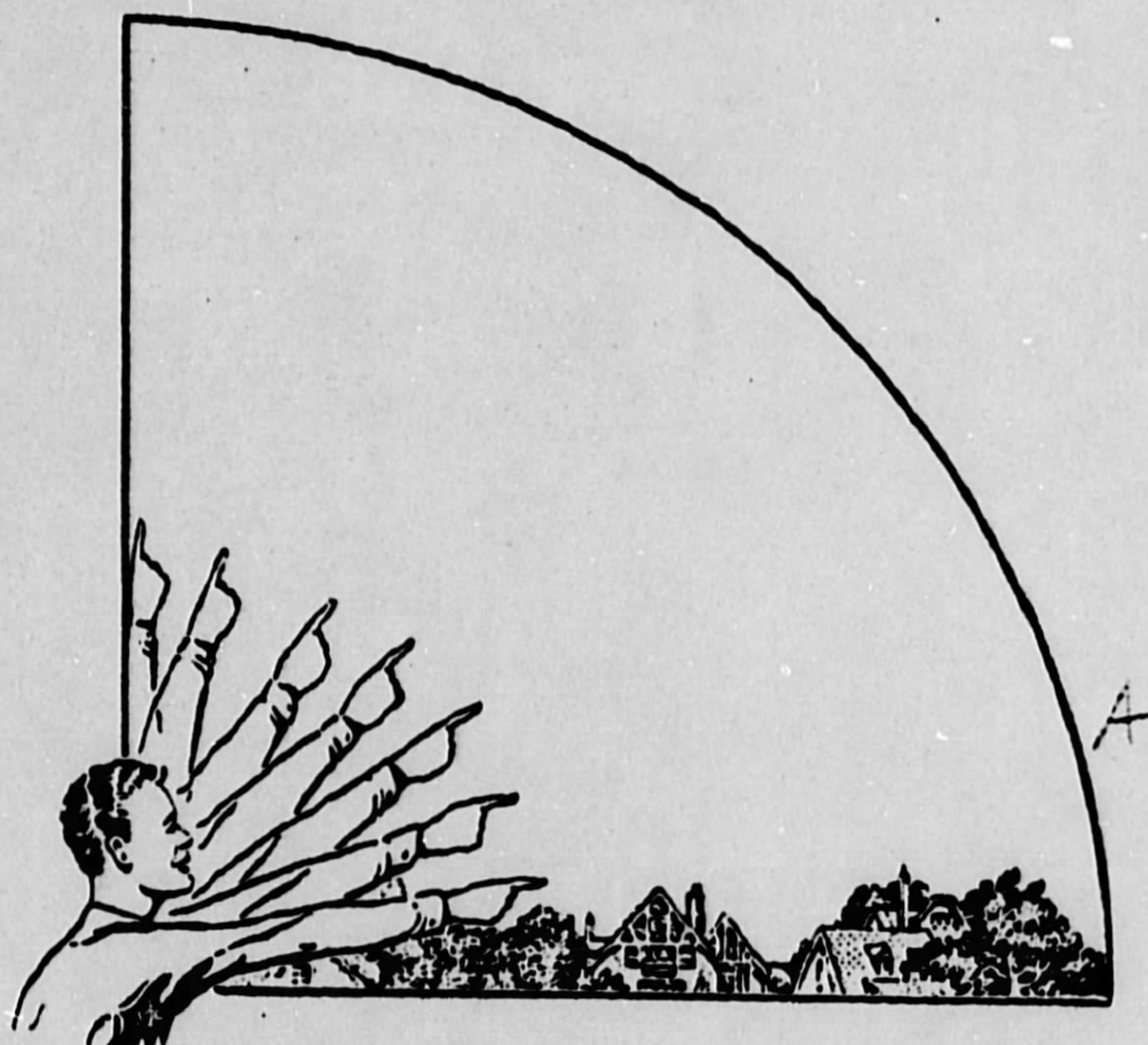

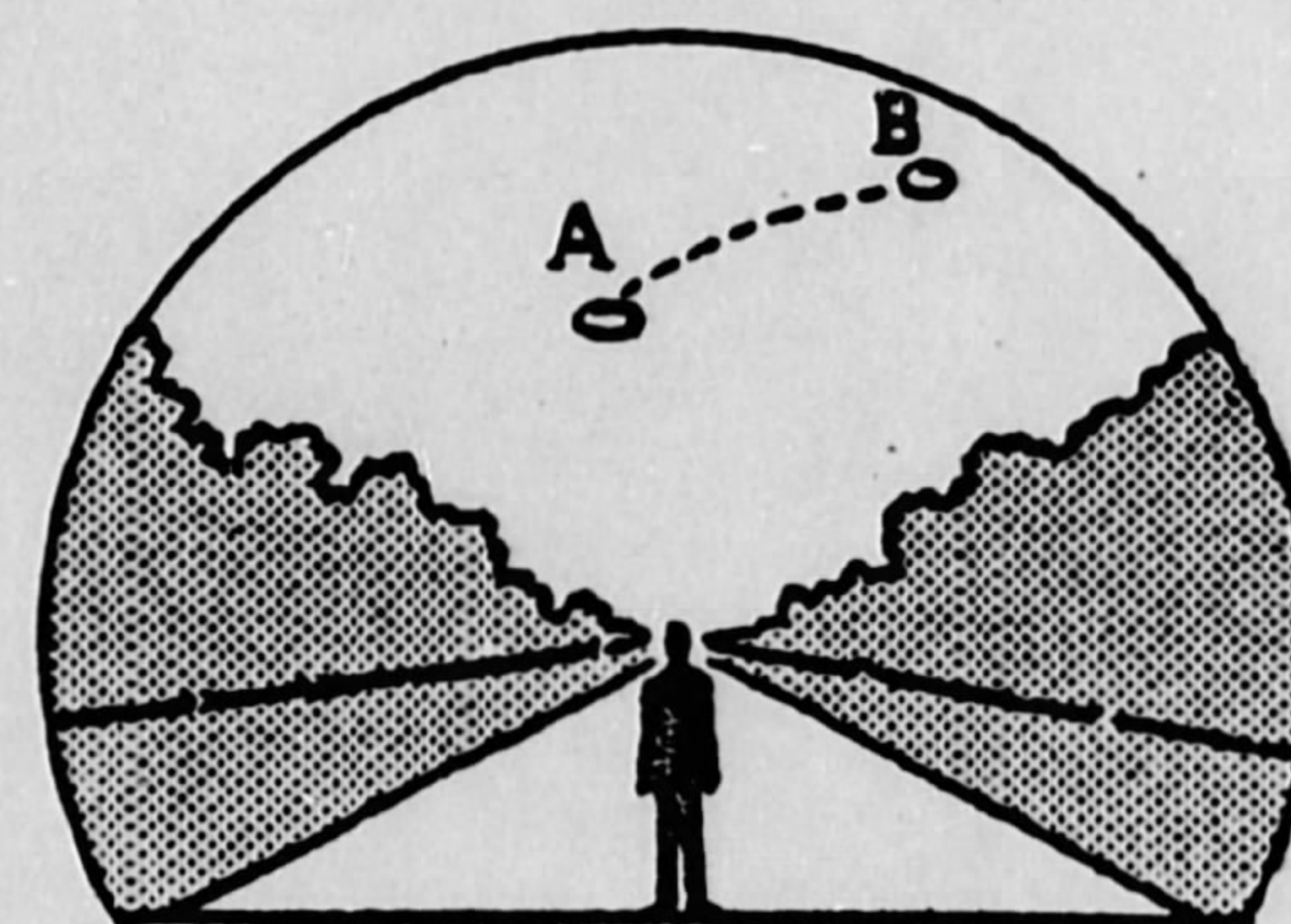
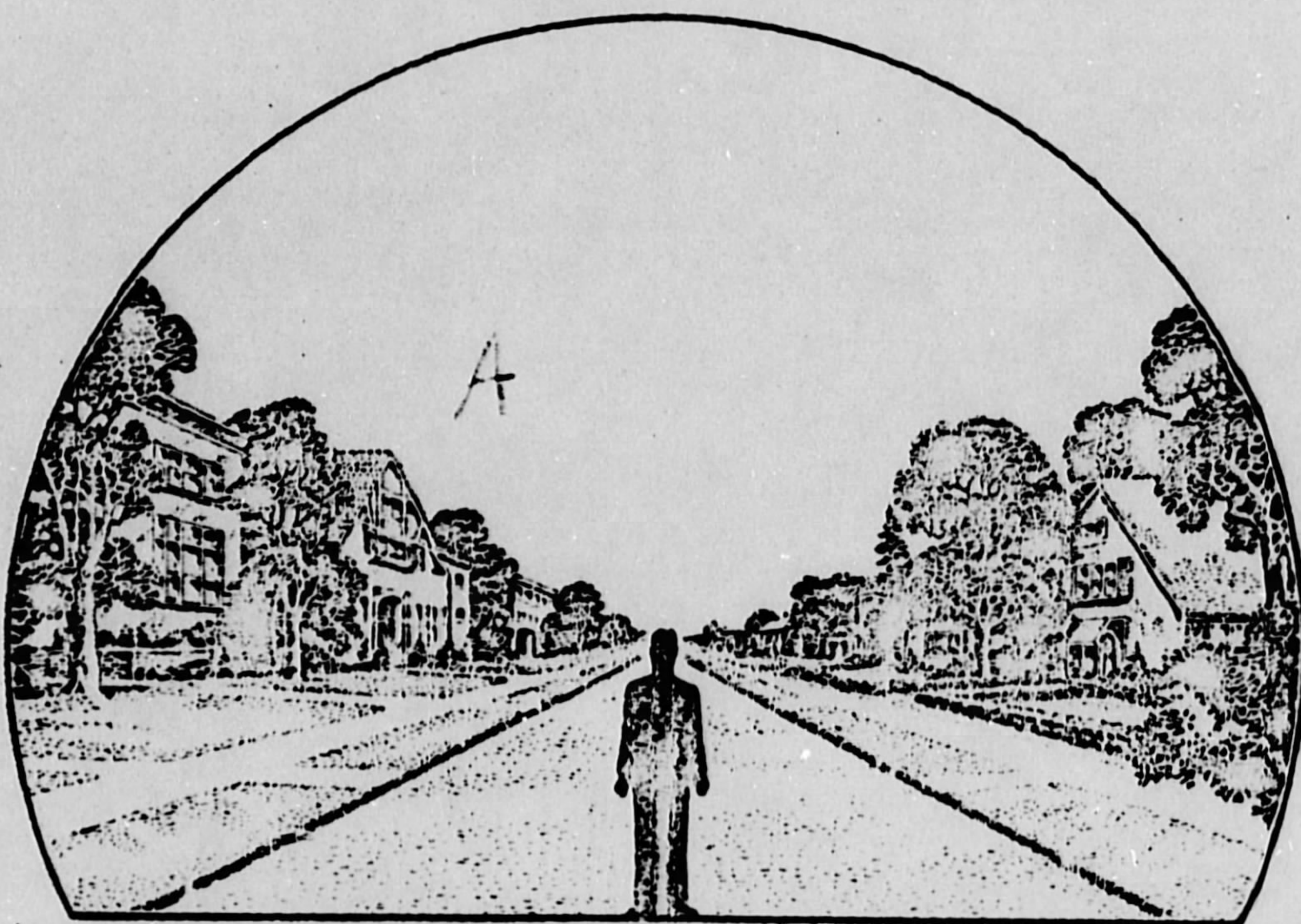

DATE June 8, 1957

I was driving along the road in my car. There were no other cars on the road at the time - this happened infrequently, as there usually is more traffic. I noticed the two dark shapes, and thought enough, though my mind was not alarmed. I have seen so many unfamiliar things I did not become frightened. Also I received a distinct impression of friendliness. Although I slowed down considerably, observing the area continuously, I did not stop until I making the turn onto the narrow bridge. The birds were still there when I drove away. Following the area over which they hovered. It is a small area with only dirt track roads. I did not endeavor to find them, come any closer. I would like to also report that I frequently saw red or orange colored lights in the general area - some in the top within 100 yards -

once two of them in a bush nearby. ^{in the daytime.} Once when
with my daughter in the car, she mentioned it
first, as I wanted to be sure I had seen it, - a
bright ^{white} star just above the car about 1 story high
above with my son, at night also, (I believe) another
red light. (Not in the direction of the nearby
airport, which maintains lights) Also the tiny
stars which appear ^{at} night or day, inside or outside,
and definitely coming intelligent thought, on occas-
ion, by placement. Also slight ticking noises are observed.

I ~~also~~ also to report that about Sept. 1955,
in Sayville, L.I., N.Y. when we changed and
permitted my son to sleep in my usual bed,
I was awakened in the night, gently, by a
dipole (apparently 3-dimensional) which
hovered over my son's bed. I observed it
from the other twin bed next to it, where
I was sleeping. It had the look of a
common reel of a clock ^(only, under) was not transparent.
Slightly fuzzy at the outside - measured (guess)
about 2 inches across - had no monument, ^{about 1/2 yard}
aroma, or anything else. It was poised ^{about} above
the center of the bed for about a minute or
so and then disappeared. I was definitely
