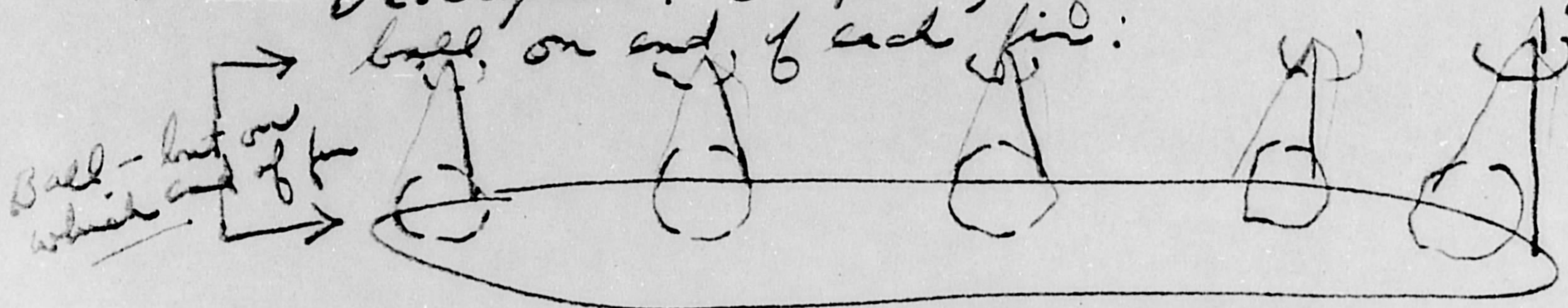

1. Strange, a number of persons apparently observed this (alleged) UFO, but only 2 persons reported it.
2. It was observed in the middle of a fairly good sized city - near noon.
3. It was observed just off the ground, ~~estimated~~ 100. height of electric light pole.
4. Observed for 10 minutes - at such close proximity - yet object ~~could not~~ be identified other than that it looked the back of a 1958 Chrysler auto. This, particularly when the object was described as of a fairly large size - 14 by 28 feet.
5. Description: Elliptical, 3 fins like 1959 Chrysler, ball on end of each fin:

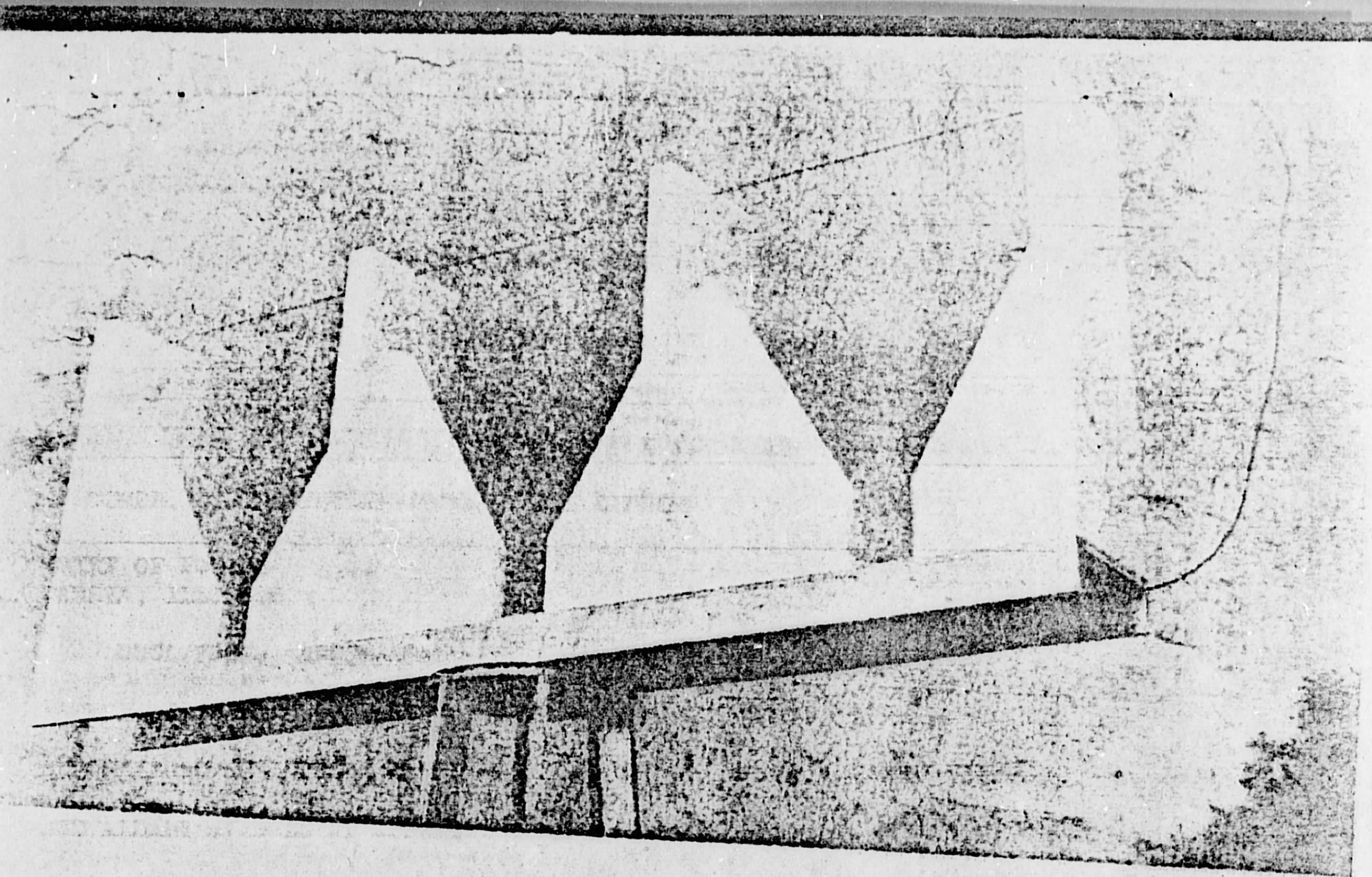

We are in receipt of your reply to our telegram of January 31, 1958 regarding a query of an incident that took place in Peoria, and submitted as part of our official investigations of the case.

It appears that your office was unaware that the report from Hanna City is the basis for our queries. This Center is the agency responsible for the screening of the investigative data and analyses of reports of this nature.

We are of the opinion that an object of the size, shape and nature reported by the principals in the case, observed in broad daylight off a street intersection would have been observed by many others and undoubtedly brought to the attention of the sheriff's office, the police or the press.

It would be appreciated, therefore, if a survey of the city's sheriff and police records be made, together with any other local checks deemed necessary by your office to determine if such an incident actually occurred or was reported. Your comments and findings will be of great assistance.

To assist you in this matter we are also attaching previous correspondence related to this case.
