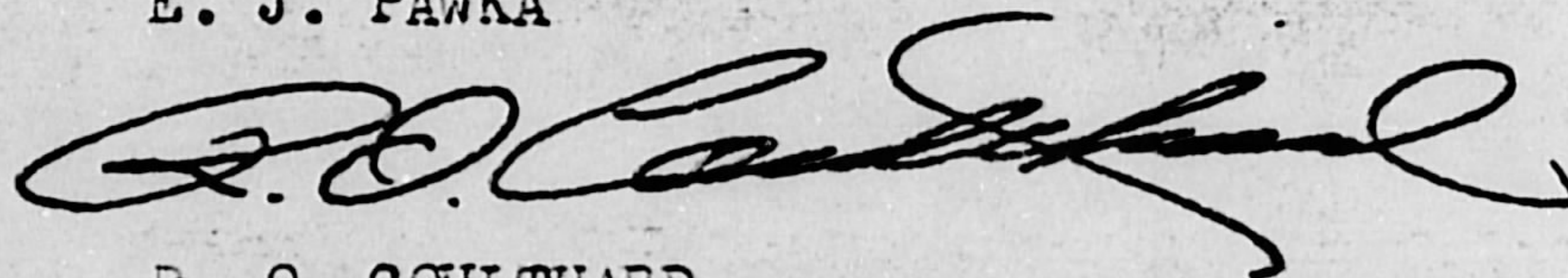

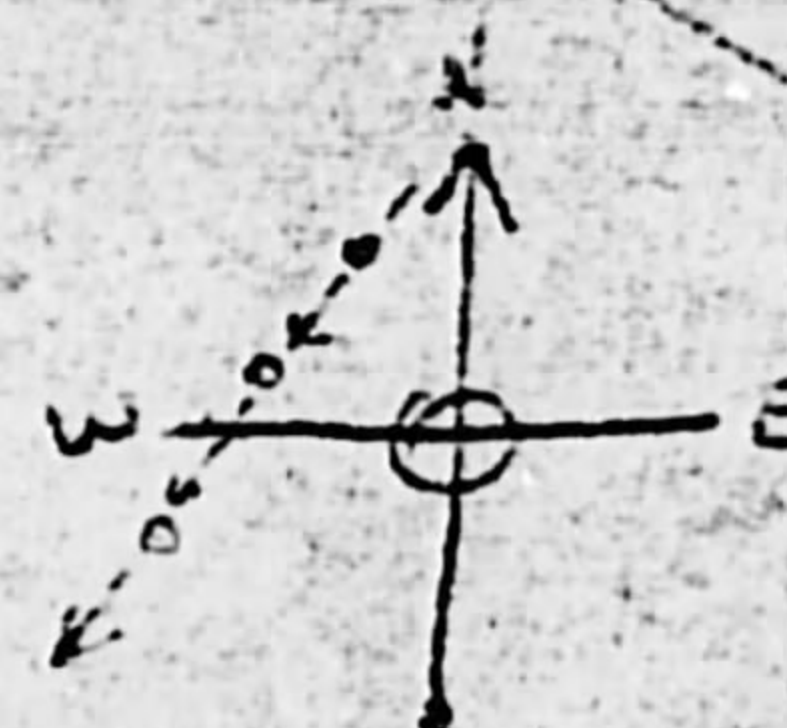

SUBJ: UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECT, REPORT OF

19502-8 = 1150 PST (Local)

NAVY JET 141677, PILOTED BY LCDR RALPH E. SYKES, SIGHTED AN UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECT AT 1905Z ON 13 JAN 1958 IN THE VICINITY OF MONTEREY, CALIFORNIA. THE SIZE OF THE OBJECT IN PERSPECTIVE WOULD COMPARE ROUGHLY TO THAT OF A SILVER DOLLAR HELD AT ARMS LENGTH BUT WAS OF ELLIPTICAL SHAPE. ITS COLOR WAS SILVER. THE OBJECT APPEARED TO BE MOTIONLESS AS IT TOOK APPROXIMATELY 10 MINUTES FOR THE OBJECT TO PASS FROM A 1030 POSITION TO A 0730 POSITION. IT WAS ESTIMATED TO BE 20,00 FEET ABOVE THE SIGHTING AIRCRAFT WHICH WAS FLYING AT 42,00 FEET.
