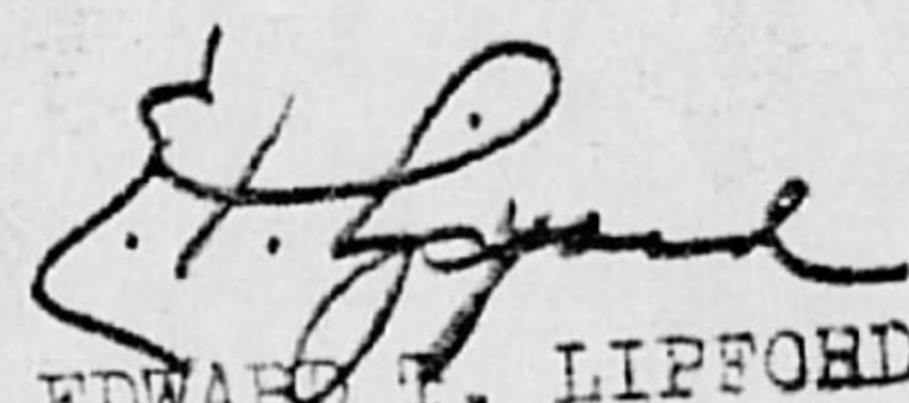

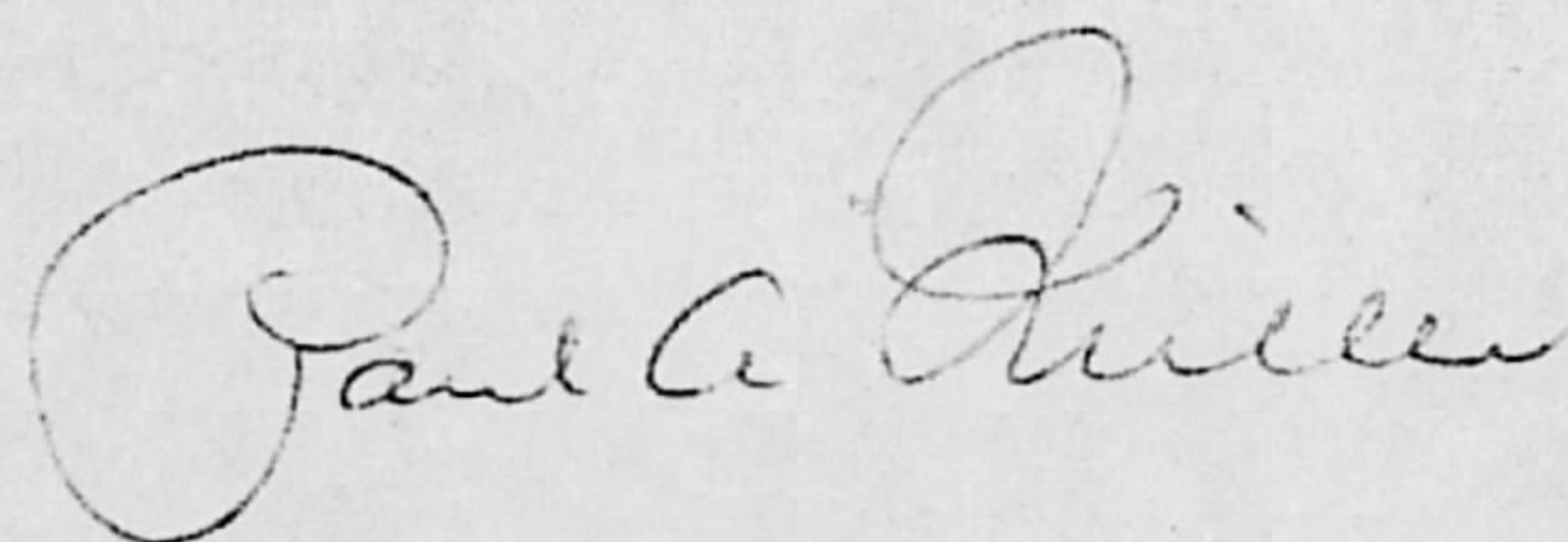

 - (e) Disappeared due to the movement of the observers away from the object.
