Even whether or not there were such things as flying saucers, it looked like part of saucerenthusiast's dreams had some more immediate promise of fulfillment.

Some had looked toward saucers with hope: to the coming of an advanced race that would teach Earth ways of peace before it was too late.

If the pinpoint of light circling the earth was not from another world, there was a chance that it, instead of saucers, might eventually be the answer.

At least the U.S. had begun to wake up to space travel, and the threat of Russian scientific development. Soon the U.S., too, would have intercontinental engines of destruction. As the atomic and hydrogen bombs may have stayed the hands of the war gods, perhaps an equality of even more terrible weapons would at least delay the beginning of another world holocaust.

Earth needed an escape valve. Her population was growing, and along with that, tension. Once out in space, perhaps man might find ample room to expand his energies in a great new and limitless frontier, and once again grow. And perhaps some day, with the universe to conquer, people might stop speaking of Russia, the U.S., England, and finally speak of Earth — one world, and that might come to pass — some day.

But as astronomers applied mathematical formulas to track the Sputnik, and as the electronic brains hummed with their data, queer, unmeasurable things were, as usual, still happening.

MAINE SKY OBJECT IS PUZZLER

A cylindrical object, giving off a silvery blaze of light, and hovering in the southwest skies over Brewer, Maine was reported seen by several persons early February 23, 1958.

None of the persons who saw the object had any idea what it may have been except that it stayed in about the same position from midnight until daybreak.

Several gatekeepers at the Bangor-Brewer toll bridge said that the object seemed to drop suddenly between 5 and 6 o'clock but that it returned to its original position shortly afterward.

A motorist, traveling along Route

nine, reported the object "almost dropped on his car."

The Officer of the Day at Dow Air Force Base said that a woman caller reported to him that she had seen the object. According to officials there, the woman was told it may have been the planet Jupiter.

Professor Maynard F. Jordan of the University of Maine, contacted at his home, was told of the sightings. He said that the object may have been either Mars or Saturn, but that he couldn't really think of anything "that would perform that way."

Jordan is professor of astronomy.
