1. The following is forwarded for your information and any action deemed necessary.
2. On 16 June 1958, Mr. [REDACTED] Security Officer, General Electric Company, Lockland Highway, Evandale, Ohio, advised that Mr. [REDACTED] an employee of said company, was in possession of a nose cone found by his father sometime during April 1958.

According to [REDACTED] the cone is of a composition other than metal and fell, burning from the sky. A tape of some sort trailed from the cone.
3. Mr. [REDACTED], parent, resides at R. R. [REDACTED] Kentucky, and [REDACTED] resides at [REDACTED] (no house number), Bethel, Ohio.
4. [REDACTED] further advised that [REDACTED] will release the cone to interested authorities at his residence, or will remand same to the custody of [REDACTED] for said release.

MEMO TO THE FILE

SUBJECT: CASE #L5C2-227

June 6, 1958

On June 2, 1958, [REDACTED] a worker in the PED Machine Parts Grinding room at column D-8, building 800, under foreman [REDACTED], extension [REDACTED], who lives at Bethel, Ohio, reported the following:

On about April 7, 1958 his father, Mr. [REDACTED], who lives at Cuzick, Ky., which is about 12 miles south of Richmond, observed a fiery object fall from the skies and land on his farm. The next day Mr. [REDACTED] found an object cone-shaped and resembling the nose of a missile, along with what he described as tape, kind or quality unknown. [REDACTED] visited his father on May 30, 1958 and after a discussion with his father on the subject of the "thing", [REDACTED] brought it to his home at Bethel, Ohio and subsequently reported it to this office. Also on June 2, this office notified Mr. Lannehan of the Cincinnati FBI office. The FBI subsequently turned the case over to the Air Force. On 6 June 1958 Agent Phillips of the OSI Cincinnati office visited this office and was given information pertinent to the case. Further, this office offered to assist the OSI in any way possible. Apparently the Cincinnati office will report the case to DO-5 at WPAFB for further action. This will conclude our activities in the case unless requested to continue by the Air Force.
