SUMMARY OF INCIDENT:

- ① TWX MSG Fr. 662nd Aircraft Warning Sqdn brought to ATIC by Det. 8, 100th AISS at 1100 hrs, 9 Apr. 1958, (MSG attached herewith). Signed by C.O., Capt. Jenczewski.
 - ② UFO records disclose no notice or report of Incident to ATIC, which, briefly: Parking lot attendant (Canton, Ohio) and Housewife (Austinburg, Ohio) allegedly reported cone-shaped object. Rep't further stated GOC post investigated, but could not locate object supposedly down in Swamp 6 miles NE of Austinburg.
 - ③ This office decided to get all the facts preparatory to requesting a full-scale ^{UFO} investigation by the local AISS - to attempt to locate the object and to get the full particulars from the reporting sources.
- INVESTIGATIVE EFFORTS: ① Telephone call to Canton Filter Center. Contacted H/Sgt Yorkley. Requested particulars regarding UFO msg, and request in the names of Sources and if place object could be "pin-pointed."
- ② Lt. J.E. Weaver, C.O. got on phone. Assured he would make a local investigation to get facts and pertinent data for ATIC (1205 hrs). Called back at 1225. Particulars attached.

SUBJECT: Telephone Conversation With C.O. Canton Filter Center, Ohio,
Lt. J. E. Weaver, Phone: Glendale 3-7676, re Canton, Ohio Incident,
7 April 1958

1. Lt. Weaver checked his chief GOC operator at Austinburg, Ohio regarding the housewife reporting the UFO as stated in TT Msg INT-4-276. No knowledge of, or location of Source. No UFO reported to that GOC post.

2. Lt. Weaver called Brookfield AFS, 662/ACWRON, talked to C. O. Capt. Powell, who checked his records. No record of anyone reporting a UFO.

3. However, when asked about the "object" reported to have fallen in a swamp north of Austinburg, Capt. Powell stated that 662nd radar picked up, tracked and identified a meteor trail. Further, this was confirmed by a Cleveland TV Station: Meteor passed over the area - and disappeared somewhere in Canada. (Most observers reporting bolides, fireballs, meteorites generally state that they fall near their locality; an optical illusion proven for over 12 years of UFO Projects existence.
