I do not know if I saw the sputnik falling.
I do not know its schedul for this part of the country.
I am sending the information that I did see. I
was one mile south of Bakersville going east.
The time was about 8:20 P.M. Saturday April 12, 1958.
There was something in the sky traveling from north
to south. It looked like a shooting star. It was
a very clear night. The object did not follow a
straight line but more like that of one leg of a
parabola. The sharpest part of the curve turning into
the south. It seemed to slow down at the end.
It was a kind of red glow in color. I thought that
if this data corresponds to the correct time and
location that the Defense department might like
to try to find it. I still can show you where
it fell north and south but don't know how far
and it was at that time.
