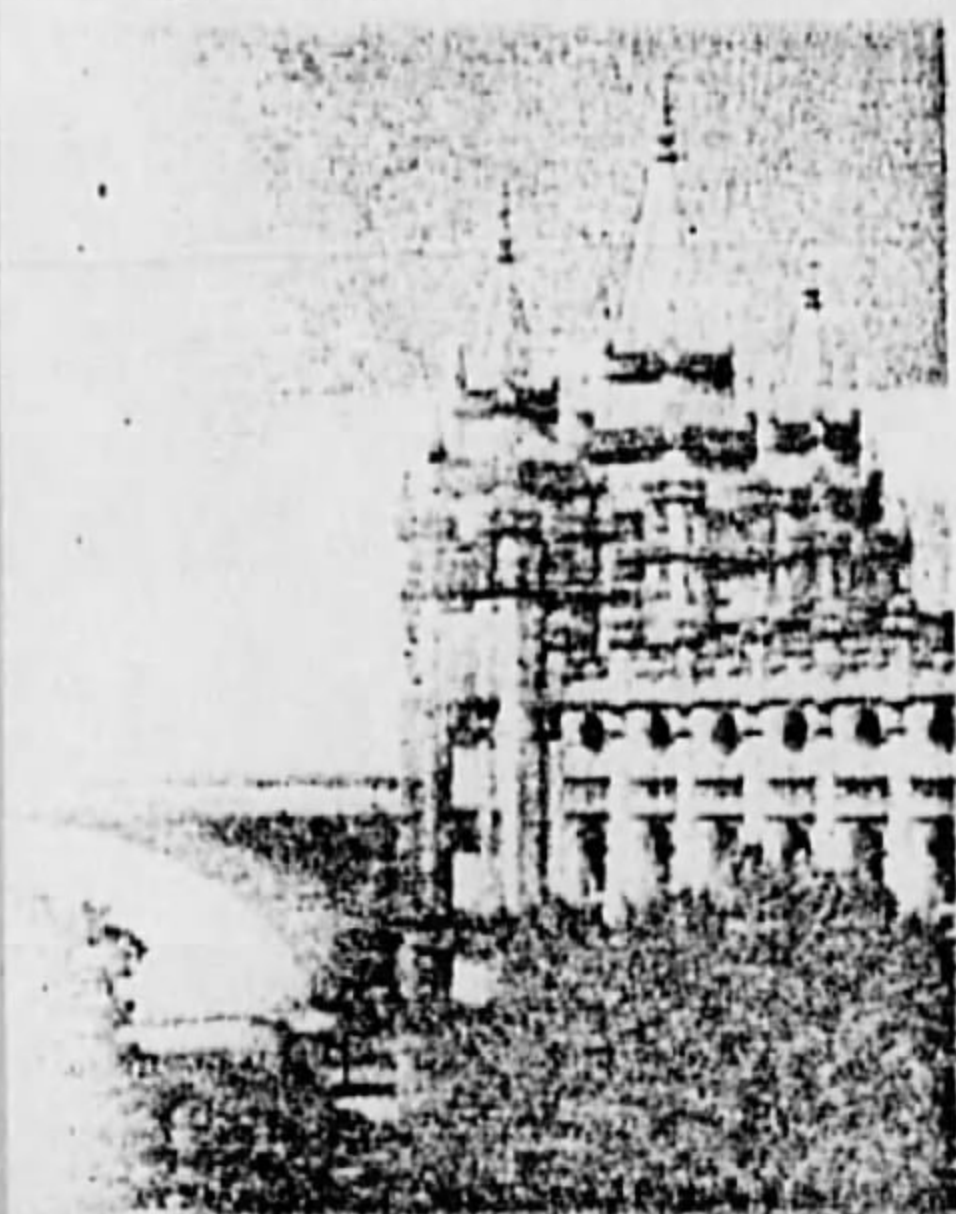

Sir:

At this belated date I write to thank you kindly for your good letter of 7 MAR 1955. Yours was in response to mine of 31 January 1955, to the Air Adjutant General, requesting permission to land on T-3. As you will know, we did not do so.

This letter is re two other points, unrelated to above.

Point 1 On the 17 APR 1958, while on duty as Hydrographer on the Colorado River (Ariz), for the U S Geological Survey, at the mouth of Bright Angel Creek in the mile deep Grand Canyon, the following quoted notation was made, in longhand, by myself.

- " ? Meteor ? 17 Apr. 9:05 PM
- Most brilliant one (Meteorite) I've seen in a lifetime---
- " More bright-white than any other coloration. (Perhaps, trace of pinkish red)
- " Obs was attracted by great or sudden brilliance. Noted to move - as if from near due West to about SWbyW (Falling at app. 15 to 20 degree angle to horizon.) Was perhaps 12 to 15* angle above Grand Canyon Rim. (Making it about 45 to 55* UP from our plane-) (HLA called quick attention to the fireball to KMH, who saw it a portion of seconds (1 or 2) at its most brilliant).
- " Completely burned out - very shortly. "

Did we observe an oxidizing meteor, or satellite section? If there be value in verification, write to:- Kathryn Maureen Henderson, who is secretary to Secretary of State for Canada.

Point 2 About 6 weeks ago, ~~██████████~~, US Mail Carrier - Richfield to Torrey, Utah noted a ~~██████████~~ moving in the atmosphere. It was cylindrical, executing right-angle turns. No sign of engine or sound. No vapor trail. Seen toward the sun, it was dark or black. Two women observed with ~~██████████~~ Air Force, World War Two. - I date from First Army Air Service, WWI. (Enlisted man - Serial #67817.)
