Co. (machinist)

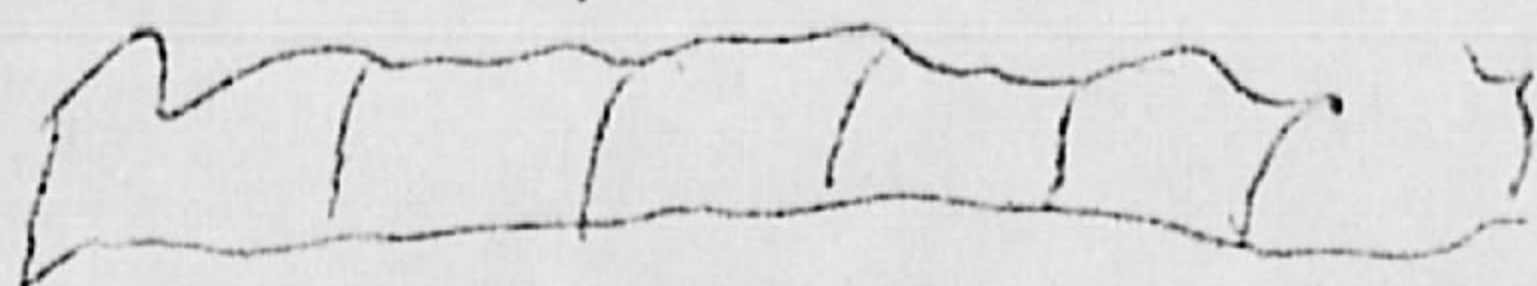
