Gentlemen:

I do not know to whom to address this letter, but I merely wish to report what seems to be an unusual phenomenon.

August 4, 1958

Last night, August 3, my husband and I were driving south on the New York State Thruway in an open car. We had just passed the gas station south of exit 20 (Saugerties). It was between 9.05 and 9.10 p.m. Suddenly from the east came something with a large green light, moving very rapidly. The light came on with a regular rhythm--I would estimate at about a second. It took only 4 lights to get across the sky to the west. The light was about as large as a green traffic light. I know that I was not the only one who saw it, because almost immediately after it passed out of my vision, searchlights from some place in the west began to rake the skies.

It was not the lights of a landing plane, and I do not believe it could have been a jet plane flying low, for I think that would have been heard.

I do not know what it was. All I know is that I have never seen anything like it, and wished to report it for my description might tie in with a report of it from another area.
