(LOCATED AT INTERSECTION OF U. S. 285 AND U.S. 66 APPROX 65 MILES
E OF ALEBUQUERQUE) WHILE TRAVELING N ON U.S. 285. OBJECT WAS
FIRST SIGHTED AT 10 DEGREES ALT AND 270 AZIMUTH, MIVING SLWOLY
E AND UP AND DONW WITH FLASHING LIGHT, PASSING OVER ROAD AHEAD
OF CESERVER. OBJECT NEXT SIGHTED 3 MILES WEST OF CLINES CORNER
ON U.S. 66, AZIMUTH 280 ALTITUDE NOT ESTIMATED. PATH WAS

*observer travelled a total of approx.
75 miles from time obj. first sighted
until last sighted.*

TOWARD OBSERVER, TRAVELING SLOWLY. OBSERVER GOT OUT OF CAR
AND OBTAINED GOOD LOOK AT OBJECT THRU BINOCULARS, DESCRIBED
AS: SIZE OF GRAPEFRUIT, RED LIGHT AT REAR END, GLOWED OVER
ENTIRE SURFACE WITH COLORS CHANGING FROM BLUE TO GREEN TO ORANGE
OBJECT SUDDENLY INCREASED SPEED TREMENDOUSLY PASSING ALMOST
DIRECTLY OVERHEAD FROM W TO E, STOPPING AT AN UNDETERMINATE
DISTANCE TO THE E AT ABOUT 25 DEGREE ABOVE THE HORIZON.
OBJECT REMAINED HANGING MOTIONLESS AT THAT POSITION WHEN LAST
OBSERVED FROM ALBUQUERQUE, OBSERVERS DESTINATION. OBJECT
SIGHTED BY A TOTAL OF THREE ADULTS AND TWO CHILDREN.
RELEASE OF WX BALLONS IN THIS AREA DO NOT COINCIDE
WITH TIME OF SIGHTING-BALLONS RELEASED AT 0500Z, TIME OF
SIGHTING 0830Z END
