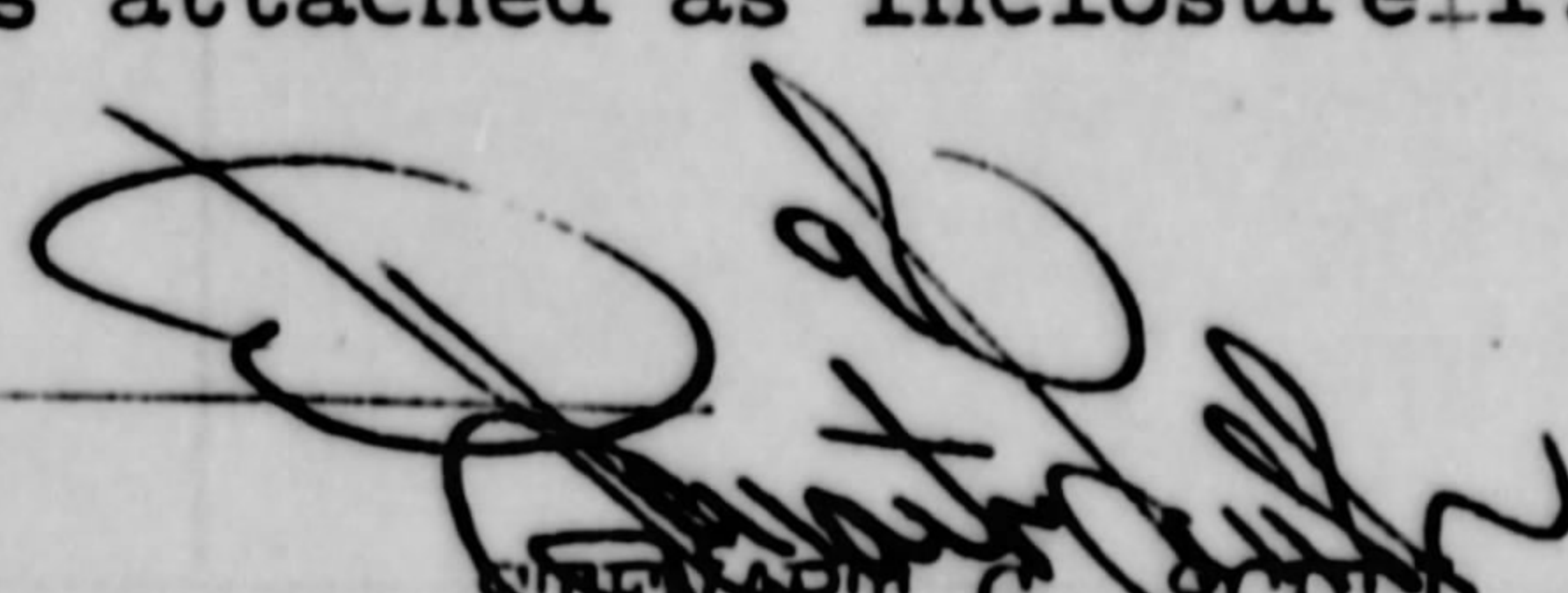

g. Weather & Winds Aloft, Conditions at Time & Place of Sighting:

- (1) Clear night with moon.
- (2) Weather information obtained from U.S. Weather Bureau (WBAS) Byrd Field, Highway #60 (located approximately 3 miles from point observer observed lights).
- (3) Unknown.
- (4) 15 miles.
- (5) Unlimited, no cloud cover.
- (6) No thunderstorms in area at time of sighting.

h. No unusual activity in the area.

i. No interception or identifying action taken.

l. No physical evidence.

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1. On 30 January 1959, [REDACTED] Randolph Macon College, Ashland, Virginia, was interviewed relative to his alleged sighting of an unidentified flying object on 22 January 1959. MOORE furnished the following information:

a. Description of the Object:

- (1) Appeared in a triangular shape.
- (2) Appeared as light clusters, no bigger than a dime held at arms length.
- (3) Color seemed to be white (3 objects), orange (4th object).
- (4) Two white light clusters later joined by a third object (which seemed to be orange in color); fourth light (white in color).
- (5) First two white lights traveling side by side. Orange light joining up, then breaking off; fourth light seemed to intercept other white lights.
- (6) Clusters of lights seemed to have a triangular shape.
- (7) None.
- (8) No sound noted.
- (9) No other pertinent or unusual details.

b. Description of Course of Object(s):

- (1) Observed two clusters of bright lights which were blinking.
- (2) When first observed appeared to be about 45° off the horizon.
- (3) About 50°.
- (4) White objects (#1 & #2) moved from North to South, then stopped. Orange object (#3) moved from North to South and it also appeared to stop. First white object(s) (#1 & #2) then moved in a westward direction with orange object (#3) on a parallel course. The orange object continued into the west until it disappeared. The white objects then reversed their direction and headed East. Fourth object (white) appeared out of the North and intercepted the first two white objects. The fourth object continued in a southerly direction and disappeared. The first two objects then disappeared in the East.
