REFERENCE YOUR MSG AFCIN-4E4-2-297-E DTD 16 FEB 59. WEATHER IN AREA AS REPORTED AT RICHMOND AND BLACKSTONE WAS CLEAR. VISIBILITY AT BLACKSTONE WAS 15 MILES PLUS. VISIBILITY AT RICHMOND WAS 15 MILES. NO WEATHER STATION AT PETERSBURG. AT TIME OF SIGHTING OF OBJECTS OBSERVER'S CAR WAS MOVING AT ABOUT 35 MPH. FIRST SAW OBJECTS WHILE DRIVING UP A HILL. OBJECTS LOOKED LIKE SILVER MIRRORS. OBSERVER COULD HAVE COVERED BOTH OF THEM WITH ONE HAND ON WINDSHIELD. THE OBJECTS WERE CLOSER TO THE OBSERVER THAN TO THE VERY HIGH CONTRAILS. OBSERVER CANNOT ESTIMATE DISTANCE OF OBJECTS EXCEPT THAT THEY SEEMED FAR AWAY.
