1. The permanent observer of the Climatic Station of Koenigsfeld (Black Forest) of the Freiburg Weather Bureau saw on Thursday evening at 2229 hours a shining yellow ball which was surrounded by a greenish halo. The ball had a speed of about 600-800 km per hour. Two other inhabitants also observed the ball on its flight from North North West to South South East.
2. On the same evening, about the same time, a young American couple - the husband is studying physics at the Freiburg University - saw the disklike flying object on the sky in Freiburg. According to statements of the couple, the disk made its appearance like a shooting star, then changed the direction of its flight and immediately afterwards went out of sight. The speed allegedly was considerably high. The observers described the object as shining white with a slight yellow shimmer.
