COMMENTS OF REPORTING OFFICER. AFTER INVESTIGATION AND ANALYSIS OF THIS SIGHTING, IT APPEARS THAT IT IS A POSSIBLE REFLECTION OF LIGHT FROM THE OXYGEN FURNACES OF THE ALGOMA STEEL COMPANY FROM A CLOUD OF SMOKE. BELIEVED TO BE SAME OBJECT IS PREVIOUSLY REPORTED IN OUR MESSAGE OPN 698 DATED 19 JUNE 59. ICE CRYSTALS AND MOISTURE FROM LAKE SUPERIOR AT A CERTAIN ALTITUDE SEEM TO REFLECT LIGHT FROM GROUND SOURCES. OCCURANCES OF THIS NATURE WERE REPORTED IN THE SAME AREA DURING SEPTEMBER AND OCTOBER 1958.
