A DIM LIGHT APPEARAD TO FALL AWAY FROM IT IT CONTINUED TO CLIMB

ALMOST VERTICAL IN A NORTHEASTERLY DIRECTION X WHEN ITS ELEVATION

FROM OUR UNIT WAS 70 DEGREES ANOTHER BUT BRIGHTER LIGHT SEPERATED

FROM IT AND FELL TOWARDS THE EAST X THIS SEPARATION IS AT 1943R

X ROCKET REMAINED VISIBLE IN A NORTHEAST DIRECTION UNTIL 1948R

X NO CONNECTIONS IS ESTABLISHED BUT AT 2004R CMM 2005R AND

2007R THREE DULL RED FLASHES WERE OBSERVED ON THE HORIZON SOUTH
