UFO sighting was reported by SAC to Maj. DeSutter in the Pentagon Command Post.

Sighting was at Bunker Hill AFB, Ind., and was observed by Control Tower personnel. Sighting was at Approximately 1600 hrs., ~~XXXXXX~~ EST, 13 Sept. 59, and control tower personnel observed it for about 3 hours. Fighters were sent to intercept UFO. They went up to 38,000ft. and still could not reach it. Estimated altitude was 55 to 60,000 ft.

Maj. Friend was called at 2030 and he will take necessary action in the morning, Monday 14 Sept 59.

B. DESCRIPTION OF COURSE OF OBJECT(S):

(1) CIVILIAN PILOT ON COURSE TO LA PORTE INDIANA REPORTED AN OBJECT AT A HIGH ALTITUDE NORTH OF BUNKER HILL AFB TO THE BUNKER HILL AFB CONTROL TOWER.

(2) AFTER THE CIVILIAN'S REPORT THE OBJECT WAS SIGHTED ~~WAS SIGHTED~~ BY THE CONTROL TOWER, BEARING 340 DEGREES FROM TOWER AT AN ANGLE BETWEEN 35-55 DEGREES.

(3) ANGLE WAS SLIGHTLY HIGHER AT DUSK AND WAS APPROXIMATELY SOUTHWEST OF BASE.

(4) THE GENERAL OPINION OF OBSERVERS WAS THAT OBJECT MOVED FROM NORTH TO SOUTHWEST RISING SLIGHTLY.

(5) OBJECT WAS SEEN UNTIL DUSK AT WHICH TIME IT BECAME INDISTINGUISHABLE.

(6) OBJECT WAS FIRST SEEN BY BASE PERSONNEL APPROXIMATELY 1800Z - 1900Z. BELIEVED TO HAVE BEEN SIGHTED ABOUT 13 SEP/1500Z BY OTHER OBSERVERS OFF BASE. OBJECT WAS WATCHED TILL DUSK.

at approx 1045- 18 Sep 59 1st Lt Oak Norton at Bunker Hill AFB called requesting information as to what org. was normally responsible for investigating UFO's and preparing the reports. He was informed that normally the base intelligence section performed this function, but all bases did not have an intell section. He was also informed that the base commander ~~was~~ was responsible for the investigation and subsequent report. However, the Commr. delegated this function to whatever organization he so desired.

1st Lt Norton also discussed the reporting format of 200-2. He felt that the format was not sufficient a guidance and offered to submit some suggestions of his own. He was told that we would be glad to receive suggestions for review.

1st Lt Norton was questioned on a few points of the UFO report submitted by his org. He stated that the object was reported to have been seen at 1000, and that it was stationary until 1700.

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ANY CALLS PERTAINING TO THIS SIGHTING. THE LOGANSPOUT POLICE DEPARTMENT RECEIVED NUMEROUS CALLS. ALL STATEMENTS TAKEN WERE IN AGREEMENT, WITH ONE EXCEPTION, MR. K. [REDACTED], AGE 53, STUDENT PILOT WHO WAS FLYING A CESSNA 172 AT 3,000 FEET IN THE KOKOMO MUNICIPAL AIRPORT LOCAL AREA STATED THAT HE SAW AN OBJECT DIRECTLY AHEAD. MR. [REDACTED] VEERED SHARPLY TO THE RIGHT LOSING SIGHT OF OBJECT MOMENTARILY. AT FIRST HE THOUGHT IT WAS AN AIRCRAFT COMING DIRECTLY AT HIM BUT LATER UPON REFLECTION HE DECIDED IT COULD BE A BALLOON. MR. [REDACTED] STATED HE WAS EXCEEDLY "SHOOK" AND RETURNED TO THE KOKOMO AIRPORT. DUE TO MR. [REDACTED] INEXPERIENCE WITH AIRCRAFT, IT IS MY OPINION THAT HIS SIGHTING WAS THE BALLOON. TO ASCERTAIN THE PROBABILITY THAT A WEATHER STATION HAD LAUNCHED A WEATHER BALLOON, MR. [REDACTED] MUNICIPAL AIRPORT, KOKOMO, IND, CONTACTED THE WEATHER STATIONS WITHIN AN AREA OF: 100 MILES WEST, 200 MILES NORTH, 300 MILES EAST, AND 120 MILES SOUTH. A NEGATIVE REPLY WAS RECEIVED BY MR. [REDACTED] FROM THESE STATIONS.
