(1) THEY THOUGHT IT WAS A SHOOTING STAR

(2) 70 DEGREES AT 150 DEGREES

(4) TRAVELED 330 DEGREES THEN MADE A QUICK TURN TO 360 DEGREES. PROCEEDED TO VICINITY OF LINCOLN AFB THEN MADE ABRUPT TURN TO 090 DEGREES. SHORTLY THEREAFTER IT MADE ANOTHER ABRUPT TURN TO 180 DEGREES AND AFTER A SHORT TIME ON THIS COURSE IT FOLLOWED A GRADUAL CURVED PATH SLIGHTLY TO THE LEFT. IT APPEARED TO STOP AT BOTH 90 DEGREE TURNING POINTS. IT DIMMED OUT AND RETURNED TO BRIGHT SEVERAL TIMES ON THE 330 DEGREE AND 360 DEGREE LEGS. ALTITUDE SEEMED CONSTANT AND HIGH. SPEED WAS VERY HIGH.

IN THEIR STATEMENTS AND GAVE A THOROUGH ACCOUNT OF THE MOVEMENTS AND ACTIONS OF THE OBJECT. THE SON IS STUDYING ASTRONOMY AND HAD BEEN POINTING OUT THE STARS TO THE PARENTS. WHILE RETURNING TO THE HOUSE MRS [REDACTED] OBSERVED THE OBJECT AND PIINTED IT OUT TO THE OTHERS. IT WAS NOT UNTILL THE OBJECT HAD DISAPPEARED THAT THEY THOUGHT TO REPORT IT TO THE LINCOLN AFB CONTROL TOWER. NO OTHER REPORTS OF SIGHTING WERE RECEIVED ON THE OBJECT. NO CONTROLLED TRAFFIC WAS SCHEDULED IN THE AREA DURING THIS PERIOD EXCEPT THOSE SHOOTING LANDINGS. THE OBSERVERS HAVE WATCHED JET AIRCRAFT AT HIGH ALTITUDES IN THIS AREA AND STATE THAT THIS OBJECT WAS TRAVELING MUCH FASTER THAN THE JETS. THE DESCRIPTION INDICATED A HIGH FLYING AIRCRAFT WITH THE EXCEPTION OF THE ABRUPT, SHARP TURNS. THE PREPARING OFFICER CAN GIVE NO EXPLANATION OF THE SIGHTING.

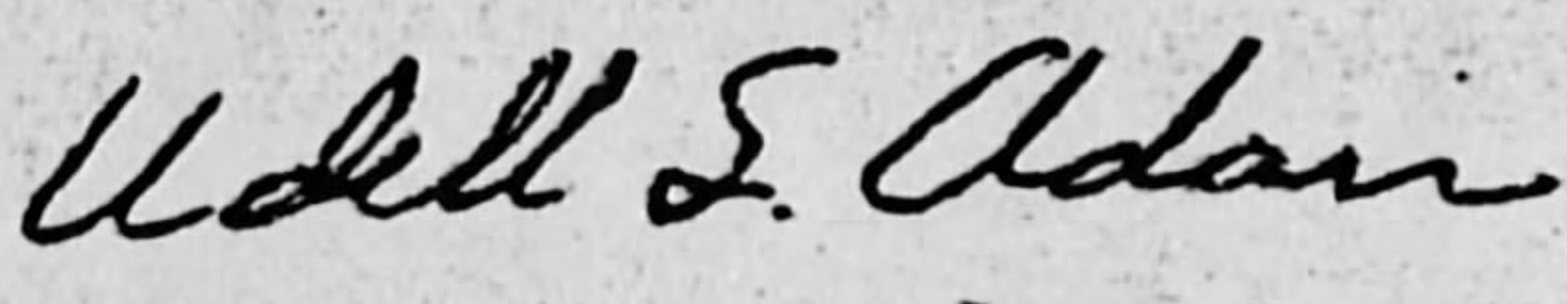
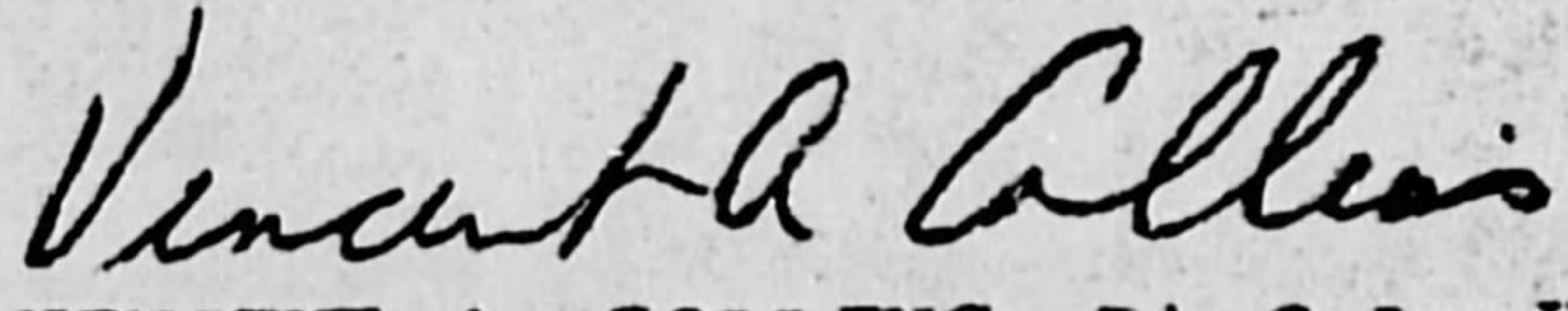

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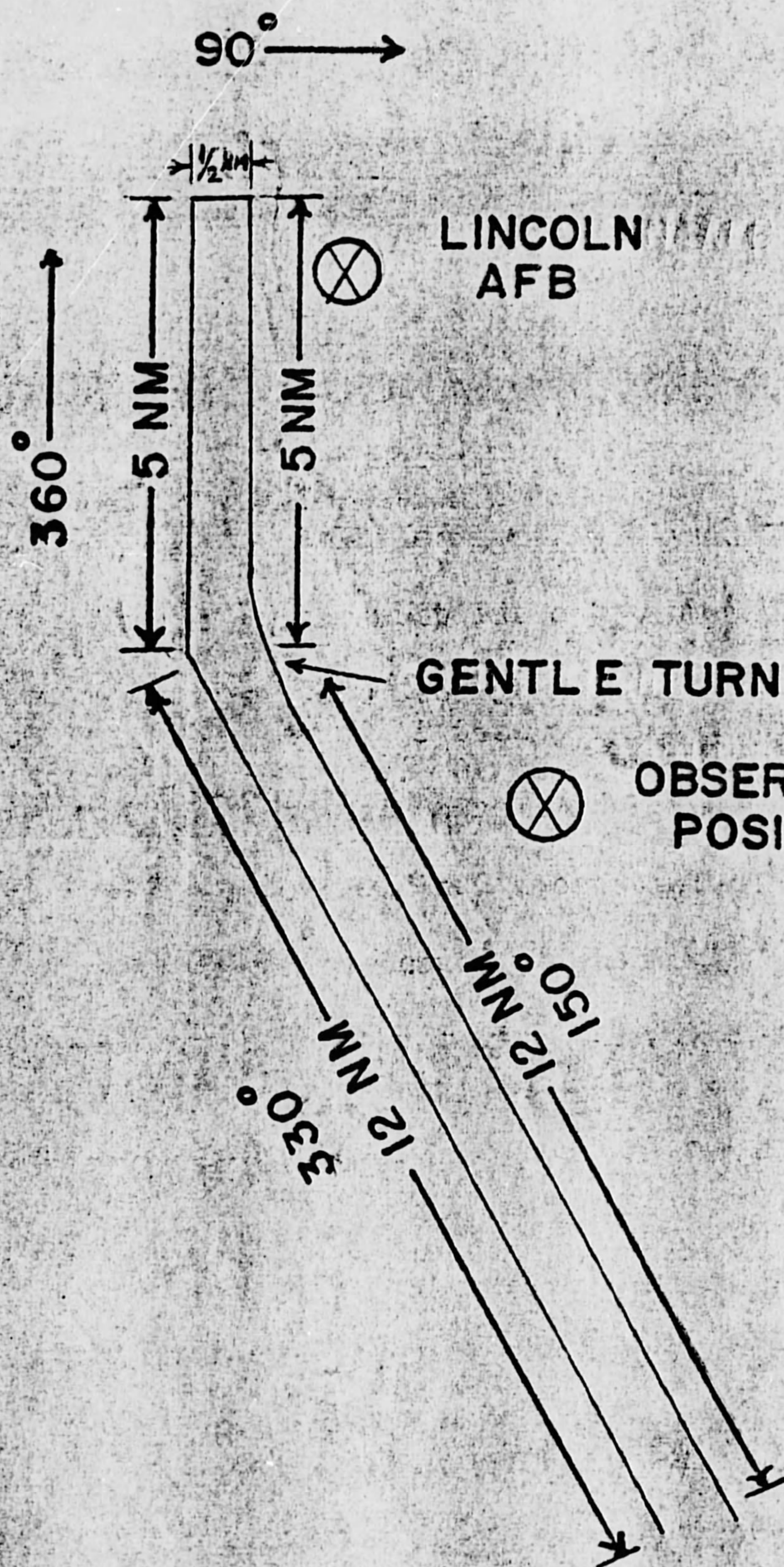

This report concerns the investigation of UFO sighted 7 Oct 59. It is supplemental information to UFO Report 98DCOI 10-959 and is submitted to complete the request of ATIC Message AFCIN-4E4G 10-2169-E, dated 24 Oct 59. In answer to questions contained in the message: (1) Observers feel it is difficult to estimate the distance traveled due to height and speed of the object but gave the approximate figures as shown on the diagram (page 2). Observers could not estimate time on each leg, however the overall time was approximately two (2) minutes. (2) Object remained a constant size throughout viewing.
