The following information was received from Major Messenger, AF Command Post referencing UFO Report received by Captain M. H. Franzen, ATIC Duty Officer, 7 October.

Two F102's from Lockbourne and one F89 from Bunker Hill were scrambled. All three reported a tally ho at 40,000 feet. The object was well above them. One of the F102's reported to NORAD that he climbed to 45,000 feet and object was still well above him. He reported that it looked like a balloon.

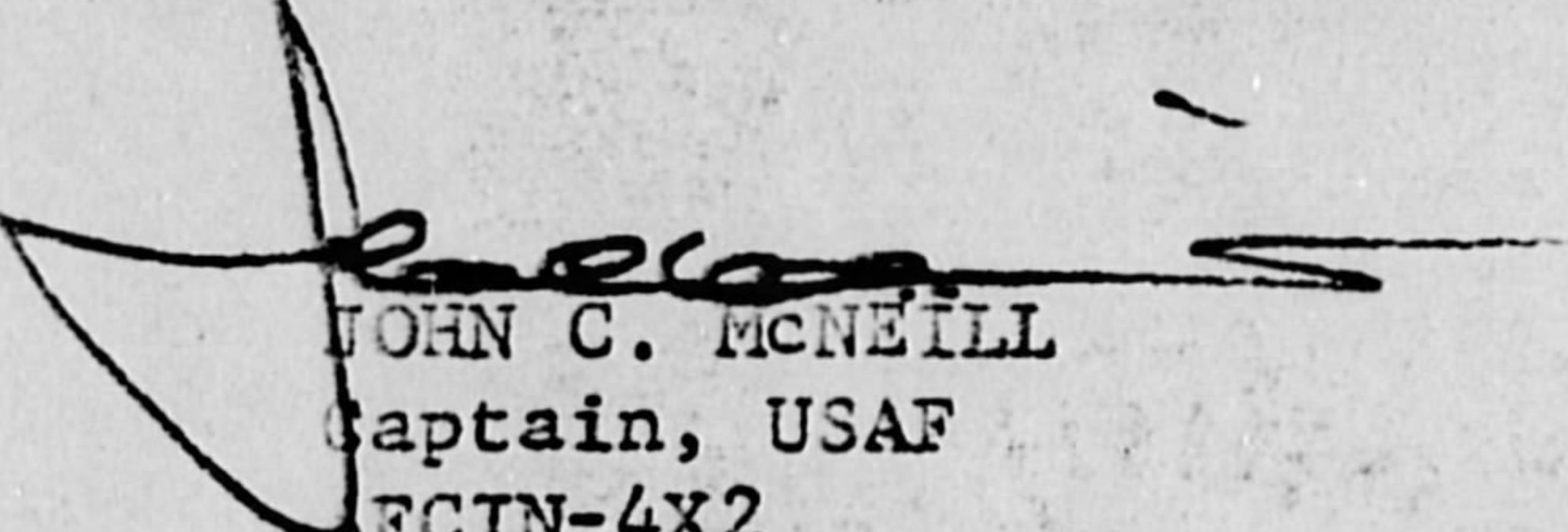
SUBJECT: Extract from ATIC Duty Officers Report

8 October 1959

TO: AFCIN-4E4g

Following is an extract from ATIC Duty Officers Report dtd 7 October 59 for your information:

- 0600 - Received a call from Mr. [REDACTED] at Patterson Ops concerning a reported UFO. It was sighted just east of Red Key, Indiana and reported to the Indiana State Police who reported it to Sgt. Reiny, WPAFB Air Police, extension 55232.
- 0645 - UFO report from Command Post in Pentagon. Object observed at Bunker Hill, AFB, Indiana. Visually observed 6 to 15 mi. from base at 1104Z and appeared to be a bright light of oblong shape moving S. to SW. Interceptor Commander observed a group of these bright lights and apparently a 102 from Lockbourne was sent up to intercept. The report was being relayed by Duty Officer at SAC Headquarters to Duty Officer at Pentagon Command Post.

State Police in Dayton received a Twx
at 05-26 8 Oct 59 from Red Key, Indiana
State police requesting info on foreign
looking object, bright flashing light which
appeared East of Red Key. They stated that it
appeared to be a satellite.

Kermit Ring asst. chief comm. off.

At 0824 EST 26 Oct 59, called Red Key,
Indiana State Police, # 2601, ~~and~~ and talked to
Mr Kermit Ring, assistant chief communications
officer. Mr Kermit gave the following info.
concerning the reported sighting of 8 Oct 59;

Mr Kermit's office has no record of a TWX
being sent to the Dayton Police. In fact, they
didn't report it to anyone. Muncie, Indiana
City police originally saw the light and called
Red Key state police on the radio and asked them
about it. The Red Key operator on duty went out
to look and could see nothing. Mr Kermit
said their conversation could be heard by
several police stations, including several in
Ohio.

At 0850 EST 26 Oct 59, called Dayton State
Patrol. The Dayton office has no direct contact with
Indiana. The Dayton office received their info
from the Piqua office. Dayton office called
Piqua office and received the following info.

Portland, Indiana police ^{apparently} overheard Muncie
and Red Key police on the radio. Portland Police
called Piqua Police by radio, Piqua police called
Dayton, and Dayton called W-P AFB. There was
no msg involved.

B. DESCRITPION OF COURSE OF OBJECT(S):

- (1) PHONE CALL FROM AN UNIDENTIFIED CIVILIAN OBSERVER IN KOKOMO,

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INDIANA.

(2) THE OBJECT WAS SIGHTED FROM VARIOUS POINTS ON BHAFB AND THE CONSENSUS OF THE OBSERVERS IS THAT IT WAS ON A BEARING OF 110 DEGREES FROM THE BASE AT AN ANGLE MF 30 TO 45 DEGREES.

(3) HHE ANGLE WAS SLIGHTLY HIGHER AT SUNRISE AND OBJECT WAS SLIGHTLY WEST OF ITS ORIGINAL POSITION.

(4) GENERAL OPINION OF OBSERVERS WAS THAT THE OBJEDT MOVED SLIGHTLY FROM EAST TO WEST RISING.

(5) OBJECT WAS SEEN UNTIL SUNRISE AT WHICH TIME IT DISAPPEARED FROM VIEW.

(6) THE OBJECT WAS FIRST SIGHTED AT APPROXIMATELY 1043Z AND OBSERVED BY BASE PERSONNEL UNTIL SHORTLY AFTER SUNRISE.

K. INVESTIGATING OFFICER: OPERATIONAL INTELLIGENCE OFFICER, 305TH BOMBARDMENT WING (M) (SAC), LT HARRY A KERSEY JR. BASED ON AN ANALYSIS OF THE INFORMATION COLLECTED IT IS BELIEVED THAT THE UFO WAS PROBABLY A STAR OR THE PLANET VENUS. THE OBSERVERS WHO SIGHTED THE LIGHT SOURCE ARE ALL IN GENERAL AGREEMENT THAT IT LOOKED LIKE A STAR. EXPERIENCED WEATHER MEN WHO WERE OBSERVERS ARE SURE THAT IT WAS A STAR WHICH THEY SIGHTED BEFORE ONLY MAGNIFIED BY AN ATMOSPHERIC CONDITION. THE PILOTS WHO OBSERVED THE OBJECT FROM 40,000 FEET CONCURRED THAT THEY BELIEVED IT TO BE A STAR. COMPUTATIONS SHOW THAT VENUS WAS ON A BEARING OF 102 DEGREES AT AN ANGLE OF 23 DEGREES AND 20 MINUTES AT 08/1040Z WHICH IS APPROXIMATELY THE SAME LOCATION AS THAT FOUND IN PARAGRAPH B2 ON WHICH THE OBSERVERS AGREE. THE BASE ISO DID NOT RECEIVE ANY CALLS ON THIS SIGHTING.

WHILE ALL OBSERVERS WERE IN CLOSE AGREEMENT ON THIS SIGHTING,
ONE OF THEM ALSO SIGHTED AN IRREGULAR FOOMATION OF 9 PIN POINTS OF
LIGHT TRAVERSING NORTH WEST TO SOUTH EAST ON APPROXIMATE HEADING OF
135 DEGREES. THESE LIGHTS WERE OBSERVED FOR APPROXIMATELY 5 MINUTES
AS THEY TRAVELED AT HIGH SPEED ACCROSS THE HORIZON AND DISAPPEARED
FROM VIEW. THERE WERE NO KNOWN AIRCRAFT IN THE VICINTY OF THE BASE
AT THIS TIME. NO OTHER OBSERVER MADE A SIGHTING OF THIS TYPE. THE
OBSERVER WHO GAVE THIS ACCOUNT IS VERY RELIABLE ONE BUT DUE TO
THE LACK ON CORROBORATING EVIDENCE TO SUBSTANTIATE THIS SIGHTING WE ARE
DISCOUNTING ITS VALIGITY.
