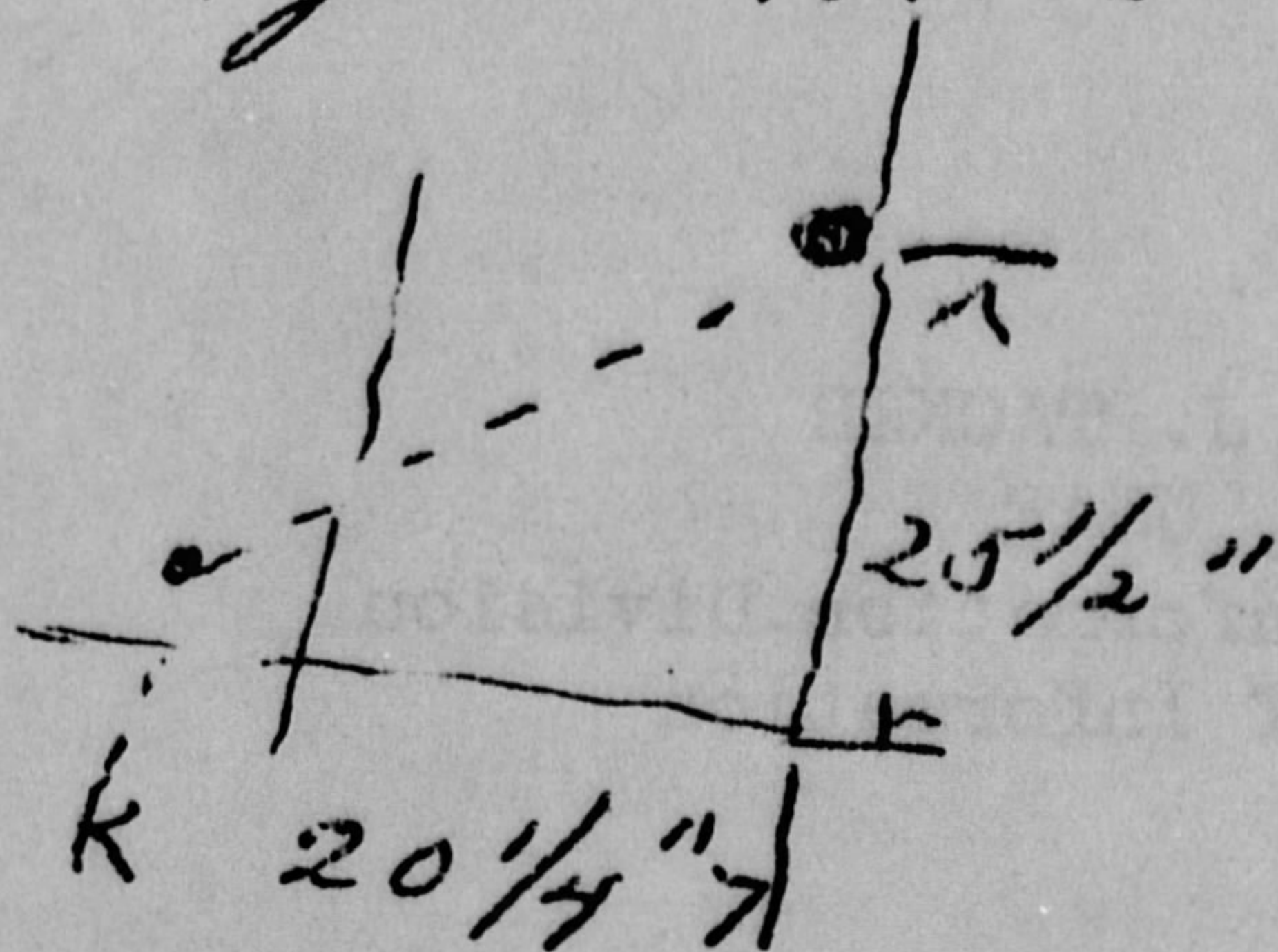

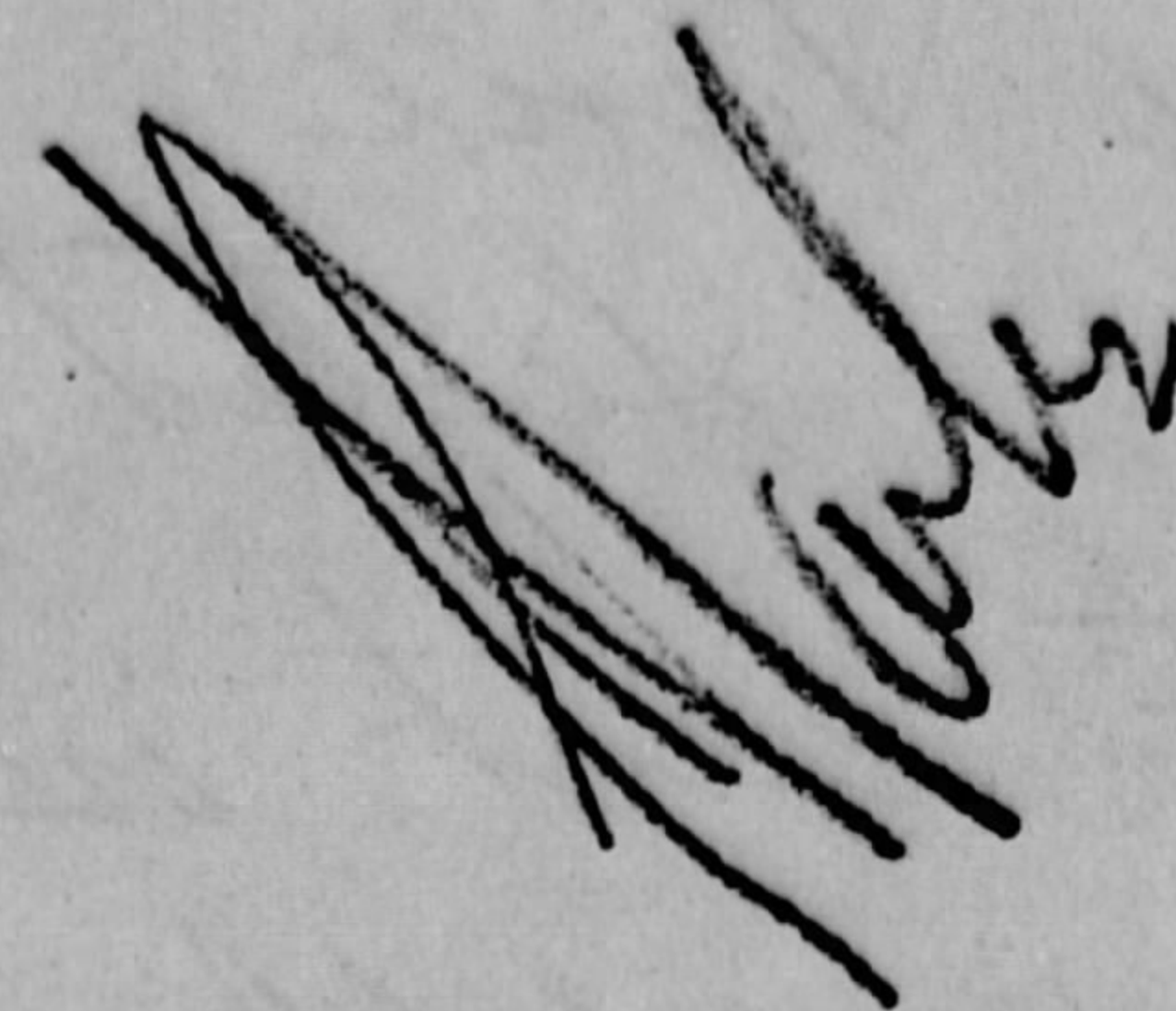
Seated on edge of bed looking
