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BOM WG (H). COMMENTS OF PREPARING OFFICER: PRELIMINARY ANALYSIS

INDICATES SOURCE MAY HAVE OBSERVED THE LARGE BRIGHT LANDING LIGHT OF THE B-52 ACFT MAKING APPROACH AT 29/0929Z JUN 60. RELATIVE POSITION OF SOURCE AND AIRCRAFT WOULD MAKE OBSERVATION OF A LIGHT ON AN AIRCRAFT MAKING A LONG APPROACH FROM THE SOUTH APPEAR AS A STATIONARY LIGHT, AND THEN SPEED UP AND DISAPPEAR AS ACFT TURNED ON FINAL. ALTUS AFB IS LOCATED 3 MILES EAST OF SOURCE'S POSITION AND THE APPROACH PATTERN IS LOCATED TO THE SOUTH AND EAST OF THE RUNWAY.
