OF 15 JULY 60.

1. THE OBJECTS DID NOT PASS DIRECTLY OVERHEAD. THEY WENT
FROM 360 DEGREES TO 190 DEGREES AS PREVIOUSLY REPORTED IN
INITIAL REPORT. THEY WERE AT A VERY HIGH ALTITUDE AND AT
APPROXIMATELY A 11:30 O'CLOCK POSITION FROM ME WHEN THEY
PASSED OVER, WITH ME FACING DUE NORTH.
