10. BRIEF SUMMARY OF SIGHTING Object sighted by 24 people. Each story differed somewhat. All agreed that it changed color from red, blue, green yellow and white. Some thought blue color was exhaust. All but one indicated object was spinning or at least showed signs of movement.		11. COMMENTS The descriptions of the object fit those of objects which have been effected by atmospheric refraction. There were many bright planets and stars in positions which coincide with those given by the witnesses. It is probable that the cause of this sighting was atmospheric refraction of common astronomical objects. This case is therefore classed as "Other" due to it resulting from the phenomena of atmospheric refraction.

"Ballute" Test Successful

Balloon To Be Used On Space Capsules

A rubber-coated fabric balloon was launched successfully in a Wright Air Development division (WADD) test yesterday over the Eglin gulf test range in Florida.

Scientists foresee using the balloon, nicknamed "Ballute" to cover space capsules, retard their tumbling and control their speed.

Nine-feet in diameter, the balloon was developed by Goodyear Aircraft company of Akron.

"Ballute" blossomed forth when inflated at an altitude of 150,000 feet—its zenith—and at a speed of more than $1\frac{1}{2}$ times the speed of sound.

A second firing of the balloon is scheduled in three weeks. Yesterday's boosting mechanism was a Cree and two Nikes. A third Nike is expected to accelerate the speed to three times the speed of sound and boost the height to 200,000 feet, during the next firing.

Here are some of the cases reported in these two issues: An Italian businessman named Signor Paolo Bracci (address: 125 Via Loreto,

Vicenza) who has to do a great deal of travelling in Europe, was on a business visit to Sweden in May, 1962. Writing on May 23 from Göteborg to Director Alberto Fenoglio of the Turin Centre, Bracci said that he had received the following account, at first hand, from a Swedish student of Agriculture named Olaf Nielsen:

"I was walking near Halmstad on the afternoon of August 25, 1960. The spot was lonely—in one side a wood and on the other sides fields—an ideal place for one who has to study. Suddenly I felt myself caught as it were in a dizziness and sucked up into the air. Despite my terror I had the presence of mind to note what was happening. At a height of some 20 metres from the ground was a flying saucer, and I was being drawn straight up to it. Finding myself in empty space like this, and turned off in such a manner, I lost consciousness. When I came round again I found myself stretched out on a very soft couch, inside a small cabin. The cabin was of a pale green colour, lit by a faint diffused light that had no source. One would have said that the light came from the walls themselves. Suddenly a door opened and a being came in. He was in every way similar to us, except that he was wearing an overall. He approached, smiled at me, and in my own language, begged my pardon for the way in which I had been carried off."

Olaf Nielsen, who found himself thus taken up aloft, use English, in a whirlwind, went on to say he was then taken very rapidly to a

subterranean space base. He continued: "It seemed as if I was not in the open but inside of that I found that I was in a large brightly lit cavern. In my curiosity, I asked the guide whether there were many of these bases on Earth. After a moment of hesitation, he replied that such bases had existed on the Earth for very many years past. Some were in Central Asia, where thousands of years ago the gods called there used to be flourishing ones. Others, he said, are on the high plateau of the Pyrenees, and in Central Africa, and in South America, where the space visitors had adapted for their own purposes secret pre-historic cities."

In a subterranean hangar, Nielsen said that he was shown several saucers, and also an apparatus for setting up a protective magnetic curtain to defend and contrain to the base. His guide explained that these were precautionary measures directed not against the people of our Earth but against the "Dark Ones," hostile space beings who come from the vicinity of Orion and who would like to conquer the Earth.

So much for the Nielsen story. Laugh it off if you like, but it contains numerous points that fit with what we have heard elsewhere. For example, does it throw any light on what happened to Oliver Bergh and the other people who disappeared in mysterious circumstances near the town of Uppsala of these classic cases in M. J. Freeman's *The Expanding Case for the UFO's*? The account of that incident is given here for the first time. It has been a matter of interest to many of us that there has been a number of sightings of flying saucers in Central Asia, and the discovery of great civilisations, and there is a growing conviction, not entirely supported by any evidence, that there still exist undiscovered pre-historic cities in the Andes.

Your letter of April 17 addressed to a Lt Colonel Erickson concerning unidentified flying objects has been referred to this office.

In your letter you direct our attention to a sighting which occurred almost eight months ago. From the information you furnish, it appears that the observer saw a white type, anti-collision rotating beacon used on some civil airliners. This light is of strobe intensity and rotates at the speed mentioned in your letter. Due to slant range visibility through the atmosphere (increased density), the strobe type light waves are bent and filtered, thereby creating colors of the spectrum with red being the longest and strongest. Atmospheric filtration would account further for the disappearance of the light for a time. (An excellent demonstration of this phenomena can be seen when the planet Venus nears the horizon prior to its "setting.") Also the planet Jupiter, and Venus as well, can be seen to perturbate from position (this is referred to as apparent perturbation). These two planets will also appear in several varying colors as they near the horizon; another demonstration of the effect of slant range filtration through a relatively dense atmospheric envelope.

A recent flurry of "flying saucer" reports from the Florida coast in the vicinity of Fort Pierce, Florida, produced the same type of report as you quote in your letter. We "acquired" a target on our Atlantic Missile Range radars and also a visual. The Air Force "scrambled" a B-57 jet aircraft to investigate. The pilot of the aircraft had a pair of powerful binoculars and when within fifty miles of the target, "glowing white oscillating light which changes color at times," he looked through the glasses and saw a civil jet airliner. A few minutes later more reports came in from ground observers and two airline pilots. The pilot of the B-57 vectored toward the target (same description). When he looked through his glasses, he saw another jet airliner with the same type of light. This was Delta DC-8 flight #322 inbound for Miami International Airport.

A check with the Director of the Adler Planetarium in Chicago reveals that they are not compiling data on the sighting you mention. As a matter of fact, the Planetarium stipulated they knew nothing about this sighting.

Mr. [REDACTED], per previous letters to you, I am enclosing the latest news release on the subject of unidentified flying objects. You must realize that we do not have the personnel or the time to accomplish the monumental task of opening up the Aerospace Technical Intelligence Center's UFO files to all those who ask. However, we do permit bonafide news media representatives to have access to these files when they so request - as many have done.

of the light," he said. "It was traveling much faster than Echo (the U.S. balloon satellite), perhaps three times as fast and its orbit was different from that of a Russian or American satellite we know about," he said.

"I haven't the remotest idea what it was."
