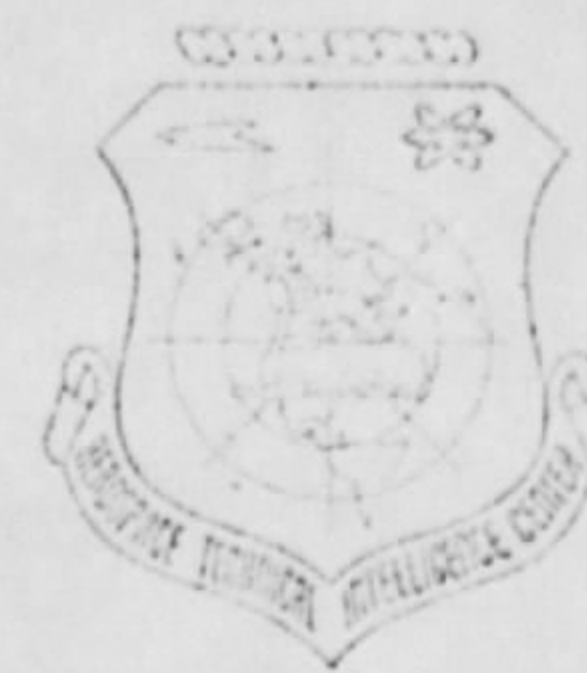

TO: AFCEH-4X2 (Major Friend)

The following, extracted from Captain Jewett's Report dated 24 September 1960, is quoted for your information.

1505 AF Comd Post (Pentagon) called to play back a recording made of a NORAD report of two Canadian ships sighting of object that fell into the water. The ships positions were 58-20N 62-40W and 58-20N 60-30W. The tape will be held for one week so a copy may be obtained if any one in AFCEH desires one. Maj. Conkey, 4A, was notified of this report.

1610 The Base CD, Hamilton AFB reported a possible MOON BUSF report from a West coast pickett aircraft. His information is keyed to AFCEH Memo 200-11 and he stated that there would be no further info. 1. 1210Z 24 Sept. 2. Coord. 39-10N 124-20W. 3. North to South. 4. 30 sec duration. Blue and yellow films.
