GROUND OBSERVATION. FIRES WERE TO DETERMINED TO BE
THOSE OF LOCAL SAW MILLS IN AREA. HELICOPTER SEARCH
OF AREA REVEALED NO SIGN OF ANY CRASH OR BURNING.
POSSIBLE CAUSE OF SIGHTING IS METEORITE.
