PILOT STATED THAT HE DID NOT OBSERVE UFO. NO CIVILIAN AIRLINES AIRCRAFT IN THE AREA. NO LOCAL FLIGHTS FROM JAMES CONNALLY AFB IN THE AREA. K. POSITION TITLE AND COMMENTS OF THE PREPARING OFFICER, INCLUDING HIS PRELIMINARY ANALYSIS OF THE POSSIBLE CAUSE OF THE SIGHTING: POSITION: 12TH AIR FORCE DIRECTOR OF INTELLIGENCE. COMMENTS: NEITHER OF THE OBSERVERS NOTED THE EXACT TIME OF THE SIGHTING. TIME REPORTED FOR THIS SIGHTING MAY BE IN ERROR BY PLUS OR MINUS 15 MINUTES. YOUR AFCIN-4E2X-11-3223-E, 4 NOV 60. WITNESS OF POSSIBLE UFO HAS BEEN RE-CONTACTED AND THE FOLLOWING ANSWERS TO YOUR QUESTIONS ARE SUBMITTED. 1. WITNESS STILL STATES THAT LIGHT WAS FIRST SEEN AT 90 DEGREES ELEVATION, DIRECTLY OVERHEAD, WHILE MOVING NORTH AND THAT IT SUBSEQUENTLY MADE A 90 DEGREE TURN TO THE WEST. 2. ELEVATION OF LIGHT WHEN IT TURNED WEST WAS APPROXIMATELY 30 DEGREES. 3. WITNESS STATES THAT THE TURN TO WEST WAS ESTIMATED TO BE A RIGHT ANGLE TURN BY USING A STAR AS A REFERENCE POINT. 4. WITNESS NOW STATES THAT OBJECT WAS OBSERVED FOR APPROXIMATELY TWO MINUTES ON

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NORTHERN LEG, THEN FOR ONE MINUTE ON WESTERN LEG AFTER TURN.
