Short duration and short flight path which was fairly level is more indicative of a meteor, which was probably what was seen. During this time of year the earth is passing through several meteor showers. The object observed by the two witnesses was probably a meteor.

Airman Mattison was seated facing Airman Carpenter in a generally northward direction.
