OCCUPATION, PROJECTIONIST, ADDRESS BEULAH MICHIGAN, AND [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] WERE PARKED APPROX 5 MILES EAST OF BEULAH MICHIGAN. A BLUISH

WHITE LIGHT APPEARED OVERHEAD TRAVELING SE TO NW, SPEED ABOUT SAME

AS A JET TYPE AIRCRAFT, ABOUT 1 MINUTE LATER THE OBJECT SEEMED TO

STOP AND CAME DOWN TO ABOUT TREE TOP LEVEL AND THEN WENT UP AGAIN

TO ABOUT 20 DEGREES ELEVATION. THE OBJECT CAME DOWN AGAIN TO ABOUT

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TREE TOP LEVEL AND DISAPPEARED. APPROX 1 SECOND LATER THERE WAS A BRIGHT GLOW BEHIND THE TREES. AFTER ABOUT 2 MINUTES OBSERVATION THE COUPLE DROVE TO BEULAH MICHIGAN AND PICKED UP [REDACTED] AGE 17: OCCUPATION FRUIT FARMER, ADDRESS BEULAH MICH AND [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] AGE 20, OCCUPATION PLUMER ADDRESS BENZONIA MICH. THE FOUR RETURNED TO THE PLACE PREVIOUSLY DESCRIBED, AT APPROX 0415Z. THE OBJECT LIGHTED BACK OF A NEARBY HOUSE SIMILAR TO A FULL MOON, BRIGHTENING AND FADING INTERMITTENTLY. AFTER ABOUT 15 MIN THEY LEFT FOR ZIMMERMAN ROAD WHICH IS ABOUT 3 MILES NW, ARRIVING ABOUT 0445A. ENROUTE TO ZIMMERMAN ROAD THEY WERE ABLE TO OBSERVE A FAINT ROTATING BEACON INSIDE OF THE GLOWING OBJECT. AFTER PARKING ON ZIMMERMAN ROAD THE GLOW COULD BE SEEN IN THE TREES SE OF THEIR POSITION. ABOUT 5 MINUTES LATER 1 RED OBJECT ABOUT THE SIZE OF A GRAPEFRUIT CAME FROM THE WOODS ABOUT 2 FT OFF THE SURFACE, MOVING VERY SMOOTHLY, SPEED APPROX, THE SAME AS A BICYCLE. SUDDENLY A WHITE OBJECT APPEARED ABOUT 3 FT FROM THE RED ONE AND THEN MERGED INTO ONE AND SPLIT AGAIN. AFTER A FEW SECONDS THE RED OBJECT DISAPPEARED. SUDDENLY 4 OBJECTS APPEARED BEHIND THE AUTOMOBILE. 2 RED AND 2 WHITE ONE OF EACH ON EACH SIDE OF THE ROAD, COMING TOWARD THE BACK OF THE AUTOMOBILE, APPROX LEVEL WITH THEIR SITTING

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POSITION IN THE AUTOMOBILE. THEY BECAME VERY FRIGHTENED AND LEFT FOR BEULAH. (TIME ABOUT 0520Z) ENROUTE THEY WERE ABLE TO OBSERVE THE SAME BEACON AS PREVIOUSLY DESCRIBED. THEY PICKED UP MR & [REDACTED] PARENTS OF [REDACTED] AND PROCEEDED TO ZIMMERMAN ROAD ARRIVING APPROX 0600Z. THE BEACON WAS PRESENT. THE RED AND WHITE OBJECT WERE NOT OBSERVED UPON RETURNING. AFTER TAKING PARENTS AND [REDACTED] HOME THE THREE BOYS RETURNED APPROX 0700Z, THEY WERE [REDACTED] OBSERVE ANY OBJECT OF ANY TYPE. THERE WAS NO SOUND OF ANY TYPE AT ANY TIME. COMMENTS OF PREPARING OFFICIAL. WITNESSES APPEARED TO BE SINCERE IN THEIR OBSERVATION. THE COAST GUARD AT TRAVERSE CITY, MICHIGAN STATED THAT THERE WAS NO AIR SEA RESCUE MISSION IN THE AREA AT TIME OF UFO SIGHTING. IN REFERENCE TO WITNESS STATEMENTS NO TENTATIVE IDENTIFICATION COULD BE MADE.
