SAID BALLOON WOULD RISE QUITE RAPIDLY AND HAS A LIGHT ON THE BOTTOM OF EQUIPMENT BEING CARRIED SO IT CAN BE TRACKED BY OBSERVERS OF THE U. S. WEATHER BUREAU. AFTER BALLOON HAS ACHIEVED ALTITUDE ITS RATE OF DRIFT NO DOUBT SEEMED EXCESSIVE TO OBSERVER AND SINCE UFO DISAPPEARED OVER OBSERVER'S HOME IT IS UNKNOWN WHERE THE BALLOON FINALLY LANDED. THERE WERE NO OTHER REPORTED SIGHTINGS OF THE ABOVE LISTED UFO.
