- (1) BRIGHT LIGHT ATTRACTED ATTENTION AS IT MOVED RAPIDLY ACROSS THE SKY.
- (2) ABOUT 60 DEGREES TO OBSERVERS RIGHT FLYING DIRECTLY SOUTH FROM A POSITION 25 MILES NORTH OF ANATHAN ISLAND, NORTH OF SAIPAN.
- (3) OBJECT FLEW STRAIGHT AND LEVEL TO OBSERVERS FLIGHT PATH THEN FADED OUT-HOWEVER OBSERVER DID NOT BELIEVE THAT THE OBJECT WAS OBSCURED BY CLOUD COVER AS THE SKY WAS CLEAR AND MOON WAS SHINING.
- (4) THE OBJECT APPEARED TO MOVE IN A FLAT TRAJECTORY-NO MANEUVERS.
- (5) FADED OUT OR BURNED OUT AS IT HEADED INEASTERLY DIRECTION.
