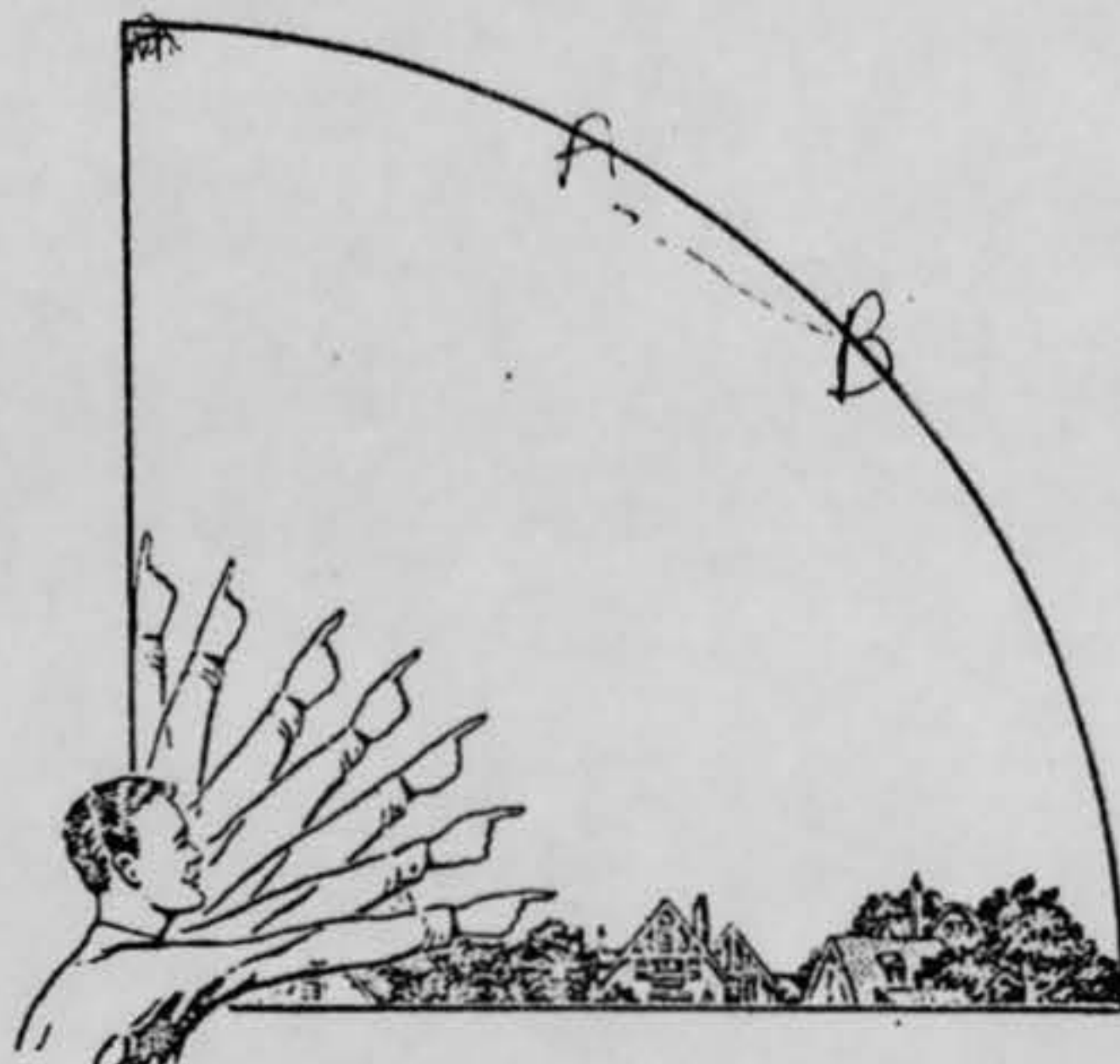

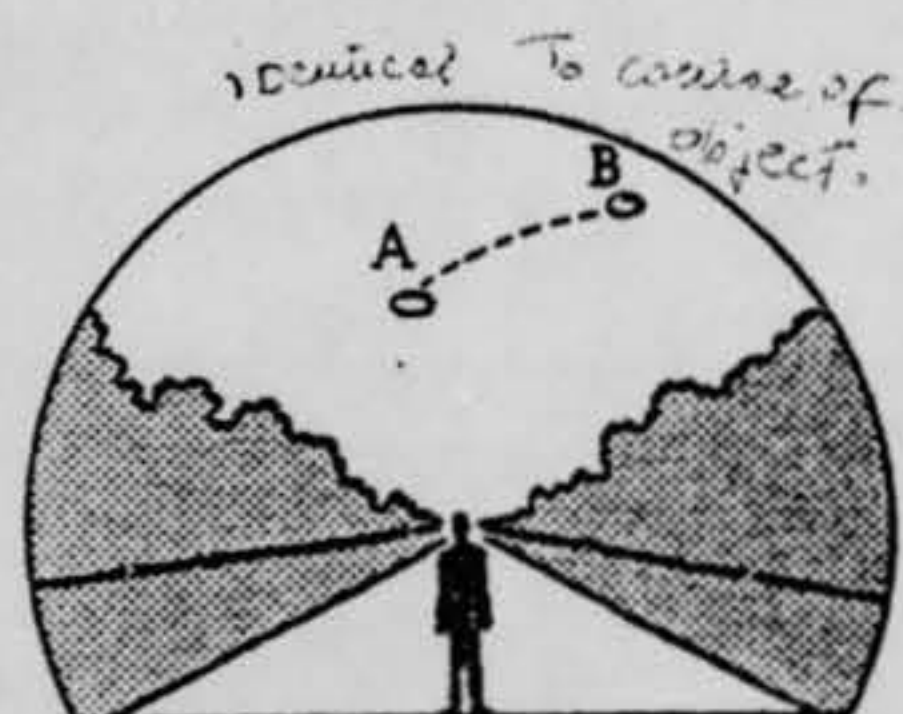
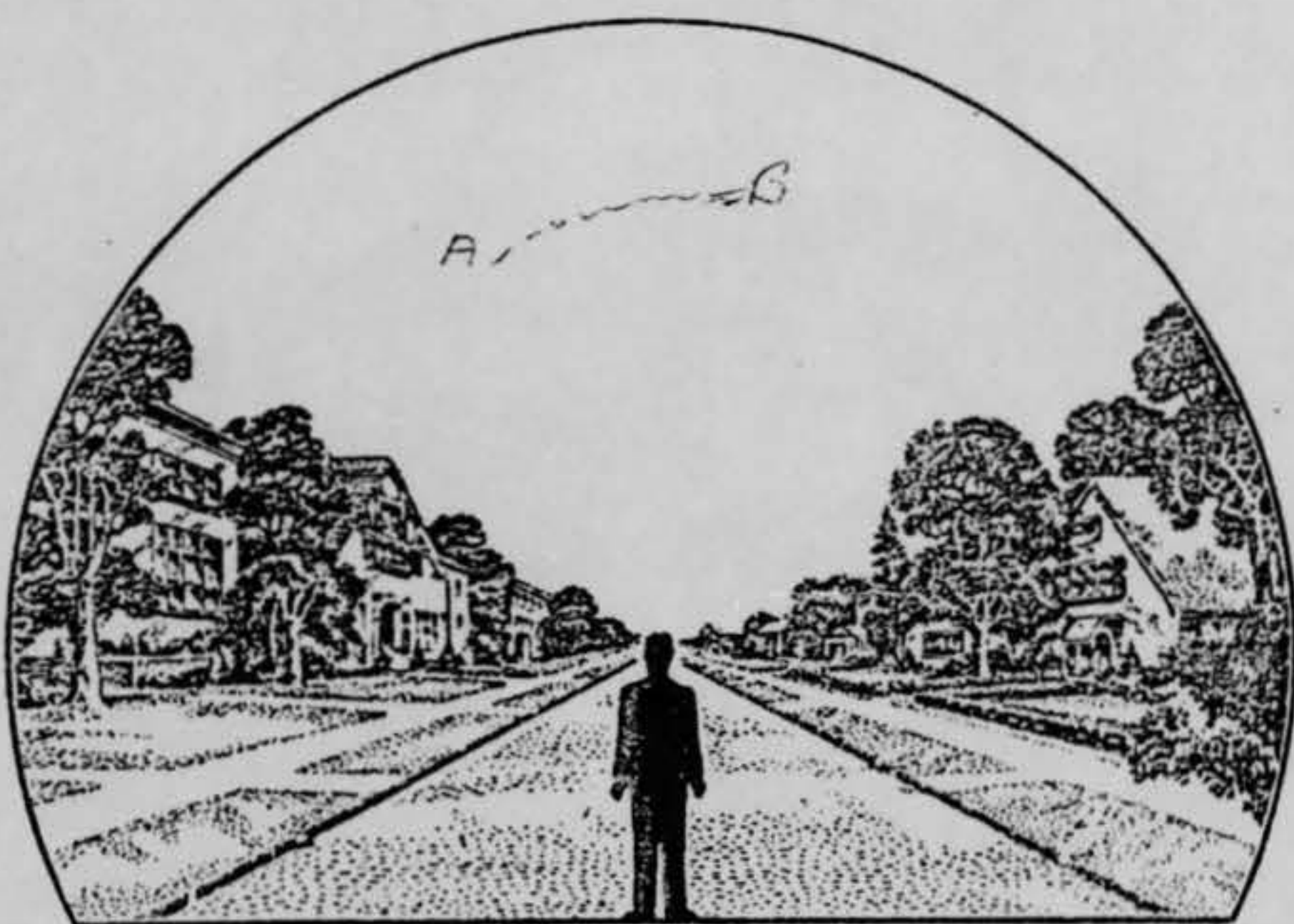

On a Saturday evening between the hours of approximately 9:15 and 9:25 P.M., a friend, Mr. [REDACTED], my 1 1/2 yr. old son and myself left my back porch, stopping to talk for a moment, prior to Mr. [REDACTED] leaving my home. As we were talking, we noticed a strange light in the north sky. The light hovered several times, and we speculated as to whether it was a helicopter or dirigible, realizing it could be neither of these, due to its large size, its lack of proper identification, and its mode of travel. Then, it circled, and as it pivoted, a whole row of many smaller, bright white lights were revealed, showing the object to be oblong in shape. It made short dashes at great rates of speed, alternately revealing the very large and brilliant bright light, and pivoting and showing the many smaller lights. We watched for possibly

7 to 10 minutes; when suddenly, at a tremendous speed, it darted off and disappeared into the north east within a matter of perhaps less than 2 seconds. Nothing we know of has the ability to hover in this fashion; nor does this shape (which was never clearly revealed, except by dim silhouette), or can go this fast or travel as high. There was no vapor trail that I recall. Mr. [redacted] left after we waited maybe 10 minutes, hoping to see the thing reappear. Many large searchlights picked the thing up and continued to scan the area after it was gone. The sky, as a matter of fact, was alive with searchlights, while it was in view. There are several new stores opening in the area, which could account for some of these. However, 2 very brilliant and far-reaching lights, possibly from Hughes Aircraft or International Airport (both nearby) were centered on this object and continued to probe the sky for a good hour afterward. I stayed out until 12:30 A.M., but there were no other objects noted.

Also, ~~many~~ many pursuit jets did take off during the thing's appearance and were travelling in the direction in which the object disappeared for about an hour after it was out of view. At this time, I called the A.T.C., informing of this occurrence; and giving Mr. [redacted]' name as a co-observer, as well as my young son.

The following is extracted from the DCAS Staff Duty Officer's Report for the period 1600 13 Oct 1961 to 0830 14 Oct 1961:

Mrs. [REDACTED] and a companion, [REDACTED], age 39, telephone number [REDACTED] observed an oblong object hovering at a low altitude. It had a brilliant light like a spotlight. It hovered for a short period, then moved very fast in an East Northeast direction and hovered again. A string of brilliant lights lit up along the sides and then went out.

The object was observed for 8 to 10 minutes and disappeared suddenly.

The sky was clear, no clouds or fog.

Report was received at approximately 2145.

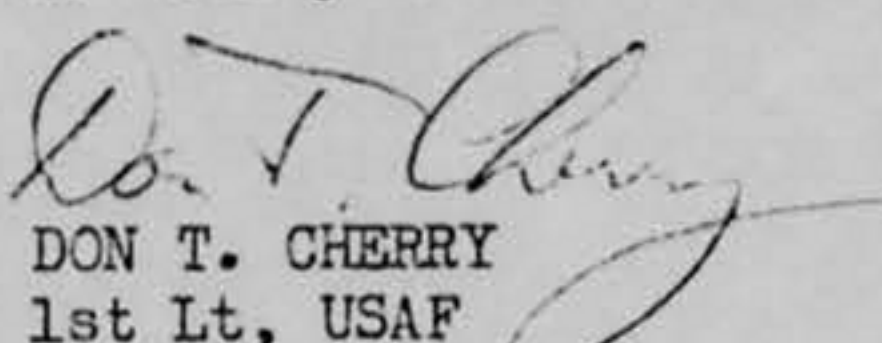

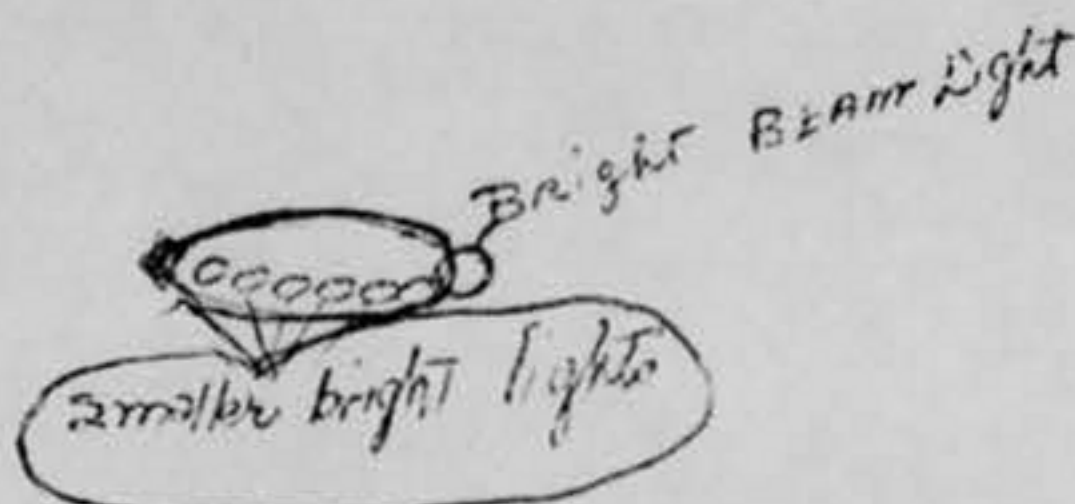

Like Nothing I've ever seen. Appeared first as extremely large, hovering bright light. Rotated twice to display many smaller bright lights along lower edge. Appeared cigar-shaped, judging by very dim silhouette.
