INFORMATION RECEIVED FROM CONTROL TOWER PERSONNEL ON DUTY FROM 0600Z TO 1300Z ON 17 NOV 61, INDICATED THAT THERE WAS HEAVY METEOROLOGICAL ACTIVITY DURING THAT EVENING. PART IX. THIS REPORT WAS PERPARED BY CAPTAIN RICHARD J. HAMEL, ASST. TARGET MATERIAL OFFICER, INTELLIGENCE DIVISION. THE OBSERVERS SEEMED CONVINCED THAT THE SIGHTING WAS NOT OF A METEOROLOGICAL NATURE; HOWEVER, WITH THE HEAVY METEOROLOGICAL ACTIVITY OF THAT EVENING IT IS REASONABLE AND PROBABLE THAT IT WAS SO RELATED. AN UNUSUALLY LOW AND BRIGHT METEOR WOULD STARTLE ANY OBSERVER AND ITS BRIEF SIGHTING COULD EASILY CLOUD THE IMPRESSION AND INTERPRETATIONS OF THE VIEWER. A. NO PHYSICAL EVIDENCE AVAILABLE.
