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Twin Fire Balls In Michigan 2

At 9:15 p.m. on April 27, 1962, Mrs. Fred Harris of Burt, Michigan, observed a brilliant green and speedy fireball with a tail which appeared half as large as the full moon. It was followed by another green ball of fire, slightly smaller, also with a tail. Both objects appeared to skim just above the tops of the trees which separated two lots. The witness said they were traveling "much faster than a plane."
