THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION PERTAINS TO AN UNIDENTIFIED FLYING OBJECT REPORTED IN NORTHWESTERN UNITED STATES AND SOUTHWESTERN CANADA: AN EXTREMELY LARGE BRIGHT, GREEN, ORANGE AND WHITE OBJECT STREAKED ACROSS THE SKY FROM A NORTHERLY TO SOUTHERLY DIRECTION. IT WAS SIGHTED BY LARGE NUMBERS OF PEOPLE ON 28 MAY 1962, AT APPROXIMATELY 224;3 HOURS, PACIFIC STANDARD TIME. THE OBJECT APPEARED TO SOME VIEWERS TO BE 200 FEET LONG. A BALL OF BRIGHT LIGHT, WITH A LONG TAIL BEHIND. THE TAIL APPEARED AS BURNING, AND PIECES FALLING FROM THE OBJECT. INVESTIGATIONS BEING MADE THE INTELLIGENCE
