SUBJECT: Report of Unidentified Flying Object (UFO)

TO: ATIC
Wright-Patterson AFB
Ohio

1. Reference is made to AFR 200-2.
2. The following UFO sighting was reported by telephone to the DCAS Command Post, Inglewood, California, at 2115 PDT, 3 August 1962:
 - a. Description: Bright, oval spot of light.
 - b. Course: Northeast at approximately 3 degrees/sec.
 - c. Observation: Visual sighting with 3X binoculars.
 - d. Time and Date: 1915 PDT, 3 August 1962.
 - e. Location of Observers: [REDACTED] Azusa, Calif.
 - f. Observers: [REDACTED], age 15, and [REDACTED], age 14, students (see preceding paragraph for address).
 - g. Weather Conditions: As reported by --
 - (1) Observers: Clear, no smog.
 - (2) Weather Station: Ontario Int'l Airport, closest weather station, reported clear and six miles visibility in haze at the time of the sighting. Winds aloft at 1700 PDT were reported as: 3000 - South 5; 5000 - West 5; 10,000 - Southwest 15; 15,000 - South Southwest 15.
 - h. Unusual Activities: None
 - i. Identification Actions: None
 - j. Air Traffic: Reported movement of UFO corresponds closely with Victor airways 1522-49, one of the primary departure routes for east and northeast traffic from the airports supporting the Los Angeles complex.

k. Preparing Officer's Position and Comments:
