Gentlemen -

I would like to report a U. F. O.
sighted on Tuesday, December 4 at 9:30 P.M.
E. S. T. at ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~, Ridgefield,
Connecticut.

When I first saw the object it
appeared like a huge star. I thought
it strange because the night was very
dark - the moon barely visible - very low
ceiling. Location was West by South West.
The object appeared to sway very slowly -
I called to my daughter & by the time
she arrived on the balcony the "star" had
moved about 100 feet to the North. It then
moved due East & we watched it until it went
out of sight - about 2 minutes. It moved
very slowly & we could hear a low steady hum.

The shape of this U. F. O. when moving East was long & gave off a glow. Very white ghost like.



I do not know how high this object was, but it seemed to be ~~quite~~ quite low. Speed was probably 150 m.p.h.
