Southeastern Minnesota, February 14, 1963. On this date a UFO was spotted over Se Minnesota. An Austin radio station said several reports were received from persons telephoning in. The Minnesota Highway Patrol also said that they had received reports of an unusual sky object. Reports indicated that the UFO came from northern Iowa and moved northeast into southwest Wisconsin before disappearing over the horizon.
