1. The attached letters received from AFNIE and [REDACTED] request photo analysis of the thirteen slides taken at the "Six Flags Over Texas" amusement park located between Dallas and Fort Worth, Texas.

2. The objects in the photographic slides are analyzed as follows: In the series of frames concerned there is an actual object moving upward and to the left across the frames. Above and attached to the main body by some type of shaft is a smaller object unidentifiable due to blur. Another cylindrical and missile shaped object is below the main body and is probably attached as its speed is the same as the main body. Therefore, the objects photographed are probably parts of the equipment in which the photographer was riding.

3. Should further analysis be desired, additional information concerning the lift, the gondola, and amusement park rides in the vicinity of the lift is necessary. If the information in paragraph two (2) above does not satisfy your requirement, it is requested that the complete film be forwarded to us for analysis.

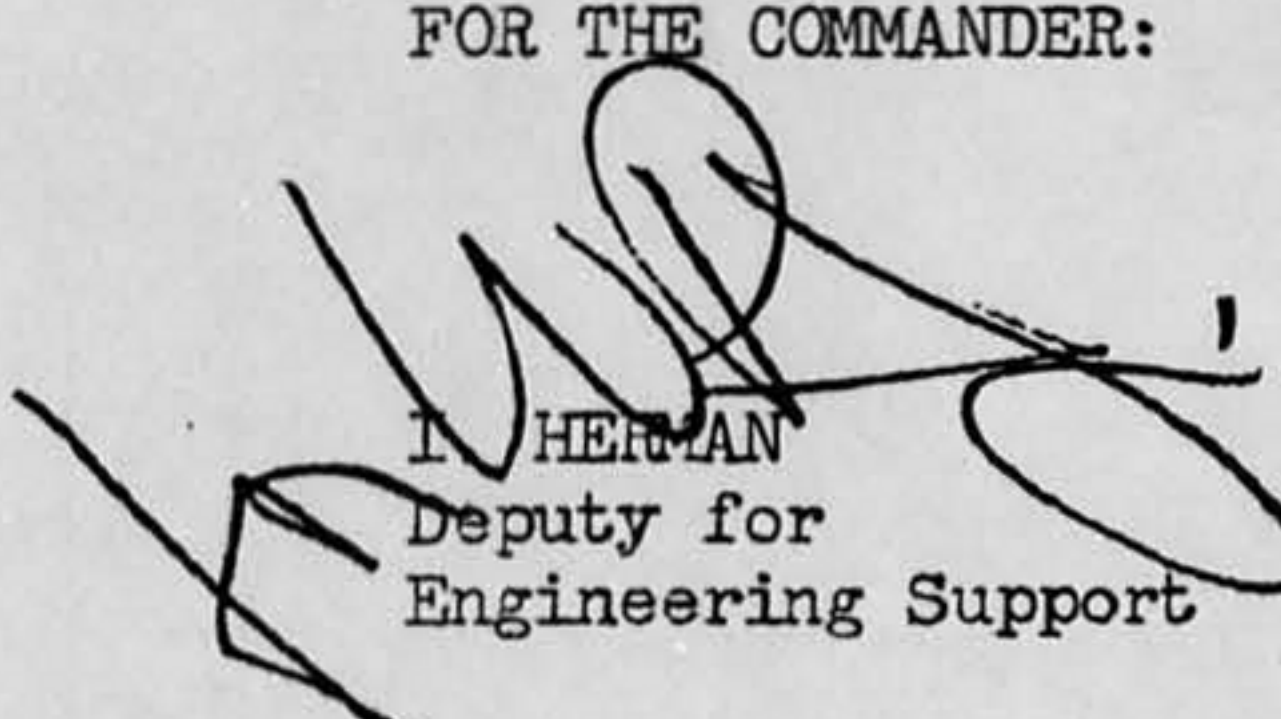

1. Transmitted are 13 slides duplicated from 3mm motion picture film. These slides show the alleged flight of an unidentified flying object photographed at an amusement park known as "Six Flags Over Texas" which is located between Dallas and Fort Worth, Texas.
2. All known facts pertaining to this photography are as follows:
 - a. Date: - - - - - Approximately 15 June 1963.
 - b. Time of Day: - - - - - Between 1100 and 1200 hours.
 - c. Type of Camera: - - - - - Bell and Howell (model unknown).
 - d. Type of lens: - - - - - Zoom lens (make and model unknown).
 - e. Sky: - - - - - Clear.
 - f. Frames per second: - - - - - Believed to be 16 per second.
 - g. The photographer was located in a ski-tow type gondola-moving. Principal object photographed was the "Six Flags Lift" shown in the background of the photos.
3. The photos were made by [REDACTED] Sharano Park, San Antonio, Texas, and submitted to AFNIN for evaluation by [REDACTED] Ala.
4. Request you submit an evaluation of this UFO report to AFNIEBA as soon as possible.
