point over FAIRFIELD
UNIVERSITY, Connecticut,
for 4:06 A.M. June 25, 1963,
Tuesday. I report the following sighting.

This silent very high altitude
elongated? object, good aerial
visibility, unconventional
pulsating white light or glow;

came in from the western
sky, due west, no sonic
vibrations, and within one
to two minutes cleared
to the Eastern horizon
over Bridgeport, Connecticut,
where it became non-
visible, due to its fantastic
speed which I estimate
could be 2-3 times the
speed of satellites I
have recently accidentally
observed. At first I thought
I was observing a SATELLITE!
My W.W.I.I. Signal Corps ground
observer-radar training & ex-
private pilot training & license
qualifications should be taken seriously.
Several years ago, I, & 2 persons saw 30 F.O.'s over
LONG ISLAND SOUND.
