ON LAKE GEORGE, N.Y. MY NEPHEW,
~~REDACTED~~, AGE 11, AND I WERE
OBSERVING THE NORTHERN SKY
IN ANTICIPATION OF SEEING ECHO 1.
THERE APPEARED DIRECTLY TO THE
NORTH WHAT SEEMED LIKE A SLOWLY
MOVING STAR OF THE SAME MAGNITUDE
AS THE NORTH STAR. THE STAR(?)
PASSED MIDWAY BETWEEN THE BIG
DIPPER AND THE NORTH STAR.
WHEN APPROX 75° ABOVE THE
HORIZON ITS BRILLIANCE COMPARED
WITH THAT OF VENUS. IT PASSED
